

### Broadcast Talks at Annual Walton League Sessions

Speakers at the Izaak Walton league national convention at Omaha, April 21, will broadcast their talks over station WOW at the annual banquet, 9:30 P. M. of that date, it was announced this week at headquarters of the organization.

Among talks to be broadcast will be those of former governor John M. Parker, Louisiana, prominent in national flood control work, and Arthur Hawkes, Canadian journalist and publicist, who will advocate establishment of an international wilderness playground area of the present Superior National Forest, Minnesota, and the Quetico Provincial Forest Preserve, Ontario.

The facilities of station WOW have been offered by the management in the interest of conservation.
