

### Robin Hood Tale to Be Theme of New Trier Drama

That mythical vagabond, Robin Hood, who preferred the shelter of the greenwood to the stone walls of ancient ancestral castles, is one of the most beloved figures in English literature. Songs, ballads, plays, even the dignity of opera have immortalized his name.

There are many tales which have grown up around this legendary hero and his merry men. They are tales of his hatred for unchivalrous deeds such as so often characterized the actions of Prince John, the usurper to the throne in the absence of Richard Coeur de Lion, his brother, away at the Crusades. Many of the stories tell of his love for the poor, whom John treated mercilessly, and of how he disregarded all laws made by the Prince, in order to help those unhappy people.

In "Sherwood," the English poet, Alfred Noyes, tells one of these stories in a simple, beautiful way. This is the play which the New Trier Dramatic club will present April 28. The familiar characters of Much, the Miller's son, Little John, Alan-a-Dale, Will Scarlet, and Friar Tuck are there, and Oberon and Titania and even Puck are introduced. Perhaps the assemblage is an odd one, but it is a delightful one. The fairy folk regard the destinies of Robin and his true love, Marian—Maid Marian—with interest. Shadow-of-a-Leaf, the fool of Marian, acts as the mediator between the fairies and humans, for he is under vows to the first, and is able to assist Robin Hood in time of need.

Because Robin loves valor and chivalry, he has a bitter enemy in

Prince John, the personification of dishonor. John is as unscrupulous in his attempts to win Marian for himself as he is in getting control of the kingdom. He is the chief obstacle to happiness for Robin and Marian.

An interesting production of the play is expected Saturday, April 28, as many of the students in the cast have had sufficient previous experience to warrant a smooth performance.
