Joseph Riddle Wins First Place in N. T. Photography Contest

First place in the photography contest conducted by the Lens club of New Trier High school recently under the direction of H. H. Herron, faculty sponsor of the club, was awarded by the judges last Tuesday to Joseph Riddle, 995 Oak street, Winnetka. The picture, an unusual one, was taken just east of Sunset Ridge Country club located west of Winnetka. It will be published in next week's issue of this paper.

Consider Restriction of Dividing Residence Lots

A new classification for certain residential areas in the village into what is proposed as "AA" residential, is being considered by the Winnetka Zoning Commission. The larger residential tracts, particularly on the east side of Sheridan road, are principally affected. A growing tendency to subdivide such tracts into building lots much smaller than adjoining sites, is given as the cause of consideration of this restriction.
