Winnetka's Fiscal Year Sets a Building Record

The Village of Winnetka, at the close of its fiscal year, March 31, with 276 building permits for total improvements of \$2,784,390, witnessed a high-water mark in its annual building records, according to A. B. Kreig, building inspector.

The previous year held the record up to that time, with a total of \$2,637,554.

During the year ending March 31, last, permits were issued for 85 new residences, costing \$1,637,300; 110 for garages, \$155,990; 19 for commercial buildings, \$662,700; 1, listed as public, \$75,000 and 61 alterations, \$253,400.

EIGHT NEW RESIDENCES FOR GLENCOE, \$173,000

Permit Total Same as in April of
Last Year, But Sum Is Con-
siderably Lower

Eight new residences costing \$173,000 were authorized by building permits issued in Glencoe during the for private garages, costing \$2,097 and month of April. Seven were taken out three for remodeling jobs costing \$2,250, the eighteen permits representing a total improvement of \$177,347.

The same number of permits were issued in April of last year, when the total in valuations reached \$348,376. Of this amount, however, \$210,000 was for two new churches on which work was started at that time. There were nine new residences in that month, but the total cost was only \$134,000, or \$39,000 less than the cost of the eight for which permits were issued this past month.

Max Ekelmann & Sons, Max Jr. and Russell, of 595 Vernon avenue, are building two fine homes on Park avenue, one at No. 115, a two-story brick and stone, for which a permit for \$25,000 was issued, and one at No. 125, a two-story brick veneer, for which the permit was \$26,000.

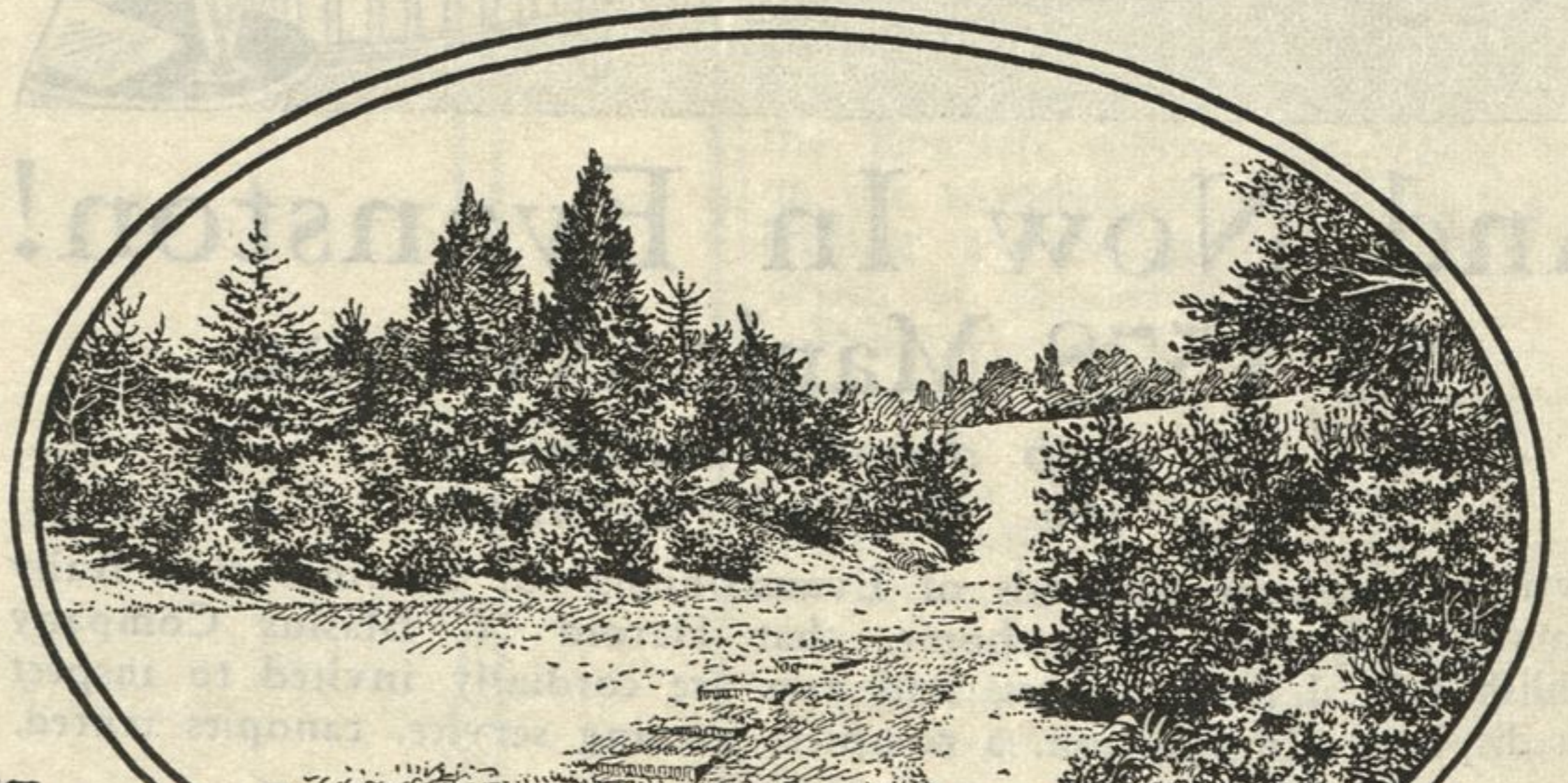

Snyder for a two-story brick veneer at 964 Sheridan road, costing \$30,000; to William Solmen, for a two-story brick veneer at 445 Sunset lane, costing \$22,000; to Sadie Cowen, for a \$20,000 residence at 235 Grove street; to George E. Schumacher, for a two-story brick and stone, at 315 Vernon avenue, costing \$19,000; to E. G. Glass for a \$16,000 two-story brick veneer residence at 1049 Bluff road, and to John Jeffrey for a \$15,000 two-story brick veneer at 820 Greenleaf avenue.
