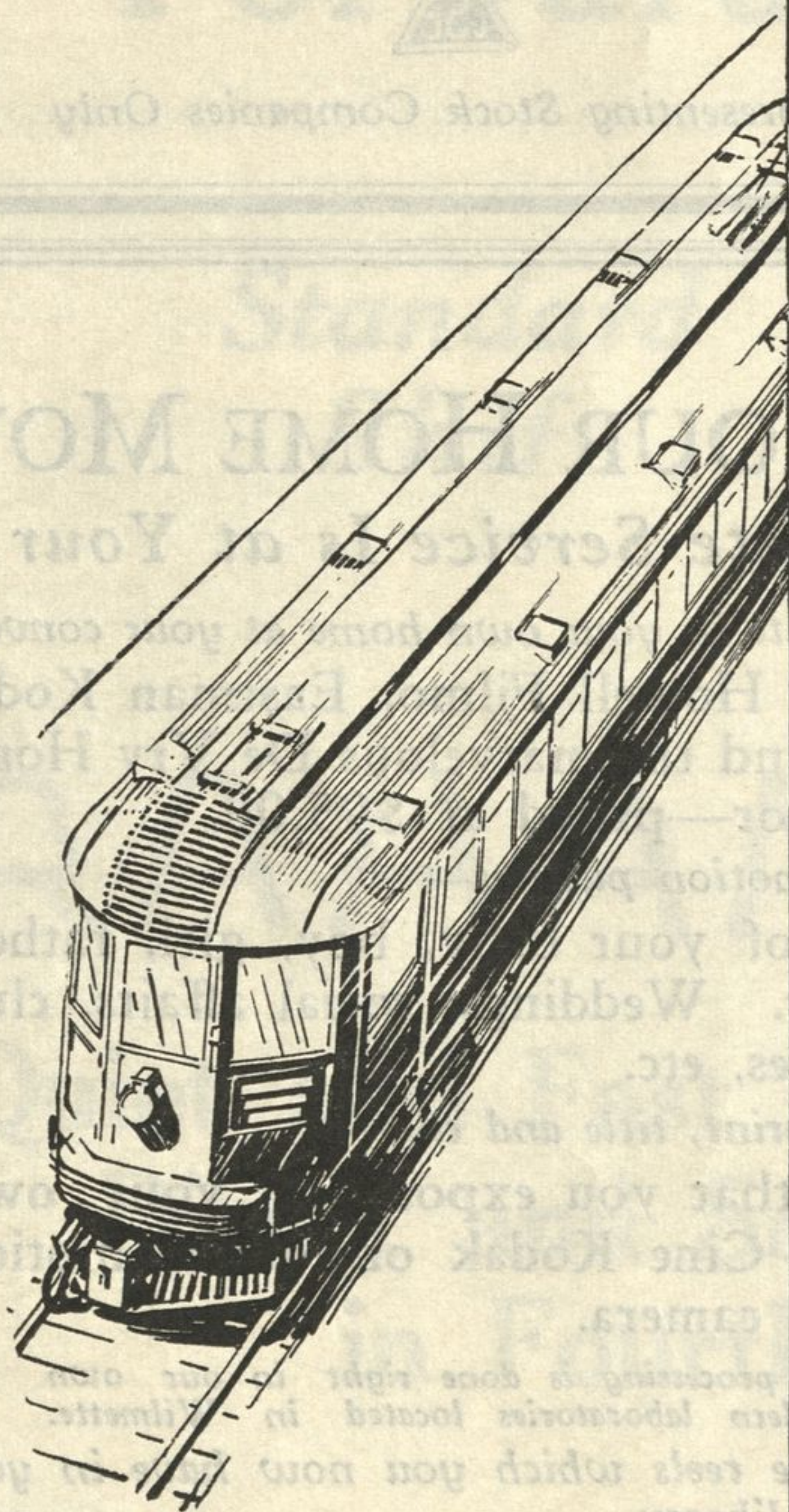
LEAVES FOR CANTON
