

Art Theatre Will Appear at Ravinia July 6 to August 1

The north shore, known throughout the world for its summer opera, is adding to its artistic institutions a Summer Art theatre.

Arrangements have been made to bring Ivan Lazareff and his Chicago Art Theatre company to the new Ravinia auditorium in a series of productions on Wednesday and Friday evenings, July 6 to August 1. There will be a new production every Friday evening.

This is the second season for the Art Theatre company on the north shore. Last year those of social and artistic temperaments found an evening at the Moraine hotel theater very much to their liking.

The opening production is Dickens' tale of Merrie England, "Cricket on the Hearth," with Ivan Lazareff in the part of John Peerybingle. The second bill is a comical satire, "The Torch Bearers," by George Kelly. Other productions are, "The Marriage of Balzaminoff," by Ostrovsky, and a series of "Sketches of Life."
