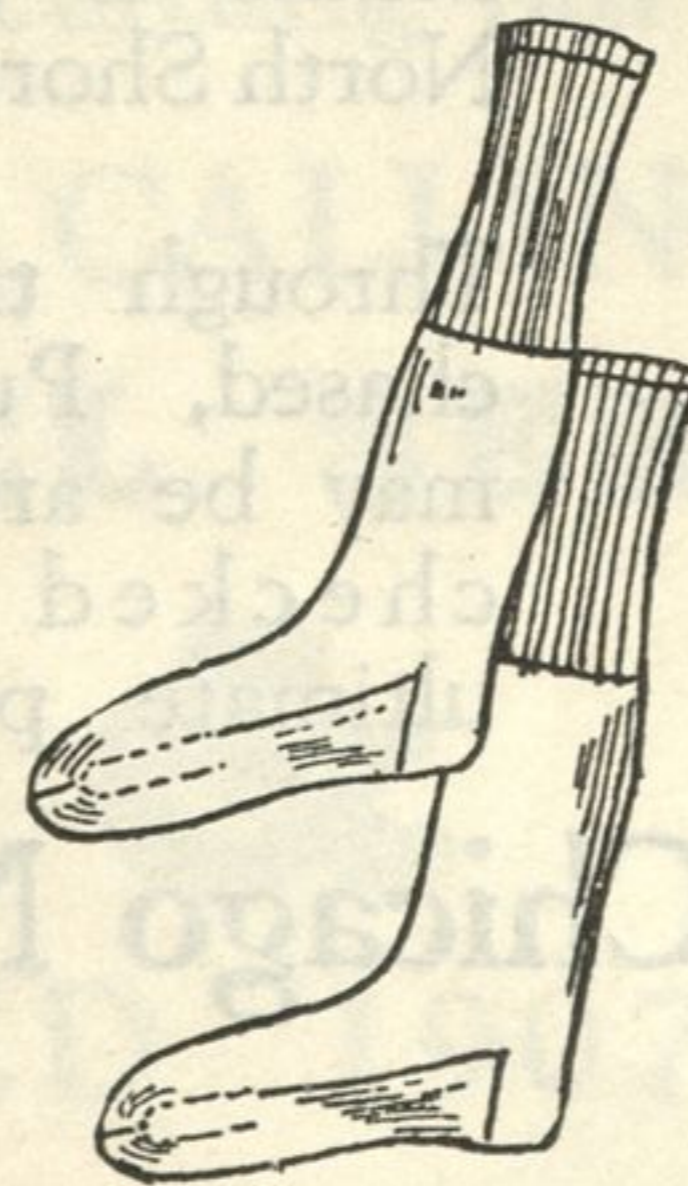

Northwestern university's prettiest coeds have gone into politics. A group of them are agitating for a wet plank in the Republican national platform.
