ELECT CLUB OFFICERS

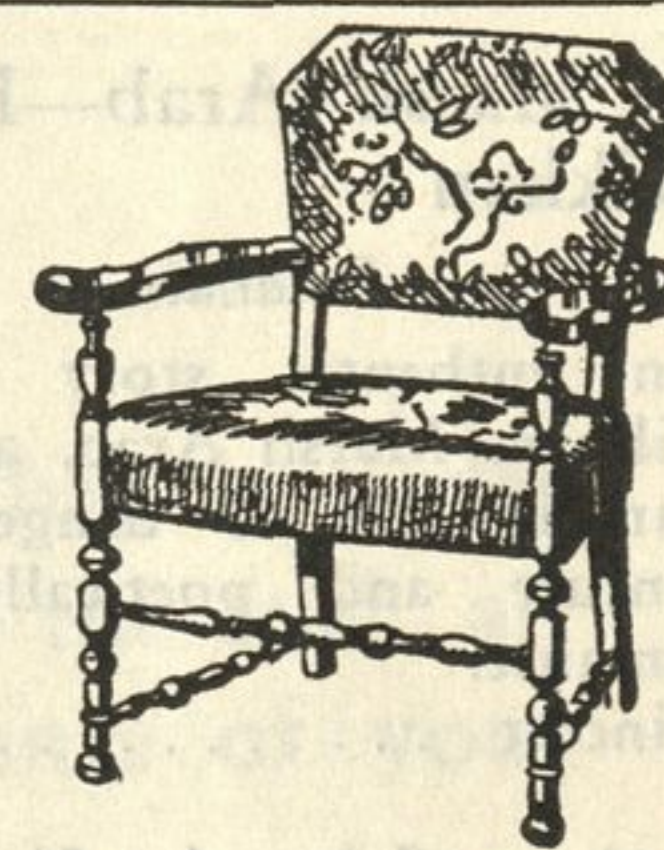

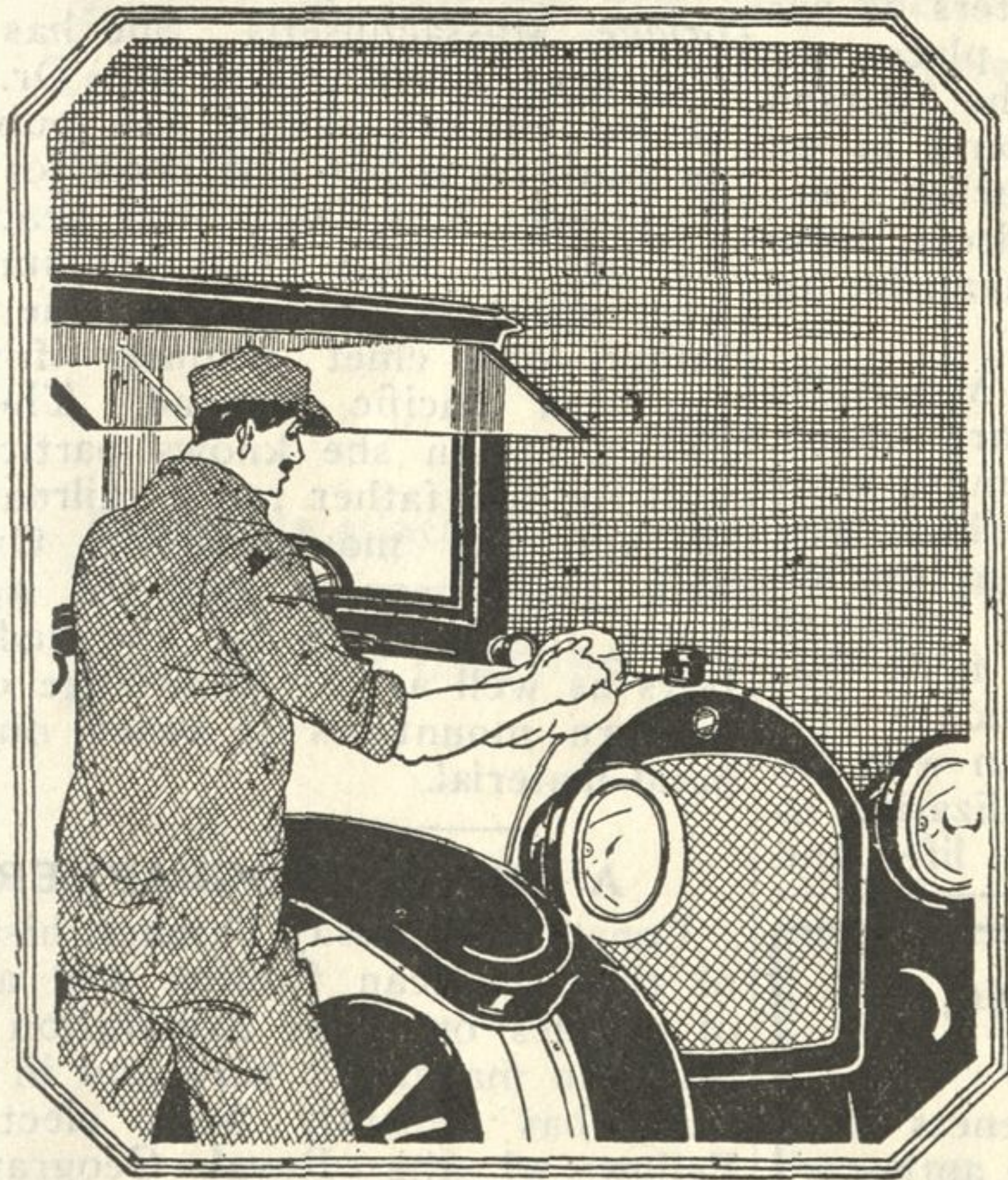
