Various groups from other organizations along the north shore, aside from the Foundation, will also help with the Festival. The Knights of Columbus are to take charge of a booth and groups of Boy Scouts will manage games of quoits and horseshoes on the grounds. There will be a kindergarten for the very young children and also for those of regular kindergarten age, conducted by girls from National Kindergarten and Elementary college, so that mothers may be free to play bridge in the Nurses' Home, shop at the different booths or witness some of the playlets which will be given by various Drama groups.

Proceeds from the affair are to be

used for the expense of outfitting and operating the emergency rooms which were recently opened.
