LAW HITS RIDE BEGGARS

Minnesota's experiment in making it illegal to solicit an automobile ride from the roadside is having a noticeable effect in reducing the number of accidents to pedestrians, according to information received by the Chicago Motor club. Minnesota's new Highway Traffic Act reads: "No person shall stand in the traveled portion of a roadway for the purpose of or while soliciting a ride from the driver of any vehicle, other than a common carrier."

New Trier Track Teams Take Meet From Deerfield

The New Trier Senior team was victorious in a dual track meet at Deerfield, by the score of 72 to 54, last Saturday. The Juniors swamped the home team, getting 70 points to Deerfield's 11.

The New Trier dashmen really won the meet. Guy, Brown and Hoffman scored slams in the 50 and 100 yard dashes and nearly did the same in the 220. Guy lead in the 220 until the last few yards when Wesley, who is also Deerfield's best quarter miler, caught up with him and was able to stick out his chest a little ahead as they hit the tape.

Deerfield's distance men almost made up for the weakness of their dashmen. They made a clean sweep of the mile and won two places in the half due mostly to the efforts of the Hammond brothers. W. Hammond kept well ahead of the rest of the field in the half until the last curve, where his brother and Ted Burgess passed him. Ted put up a hard fight but wasn't able to equal Hammond's sprint.

Milton Guy with his 13 points earned in the sprints tied Carl Hall, who excelled in the field events, for the honor of being Senior high point man. Onderdonk, Deerfield's star hurdler, and Dave Wanger were close behind with 10 points each.

MacIntosh ran up 24 points for the Juniors, winning the 50 and 100 yard dashes, the broad jump and shot put and tying with Hill for first place in the pole vault.

The visiting Juniors made slams in the high jump and 660 yard run. Powell lead in the 660 from the gun to the tape with Boyleston and Older close behind him. Kelley, Hill and Spiegel took the high jump.

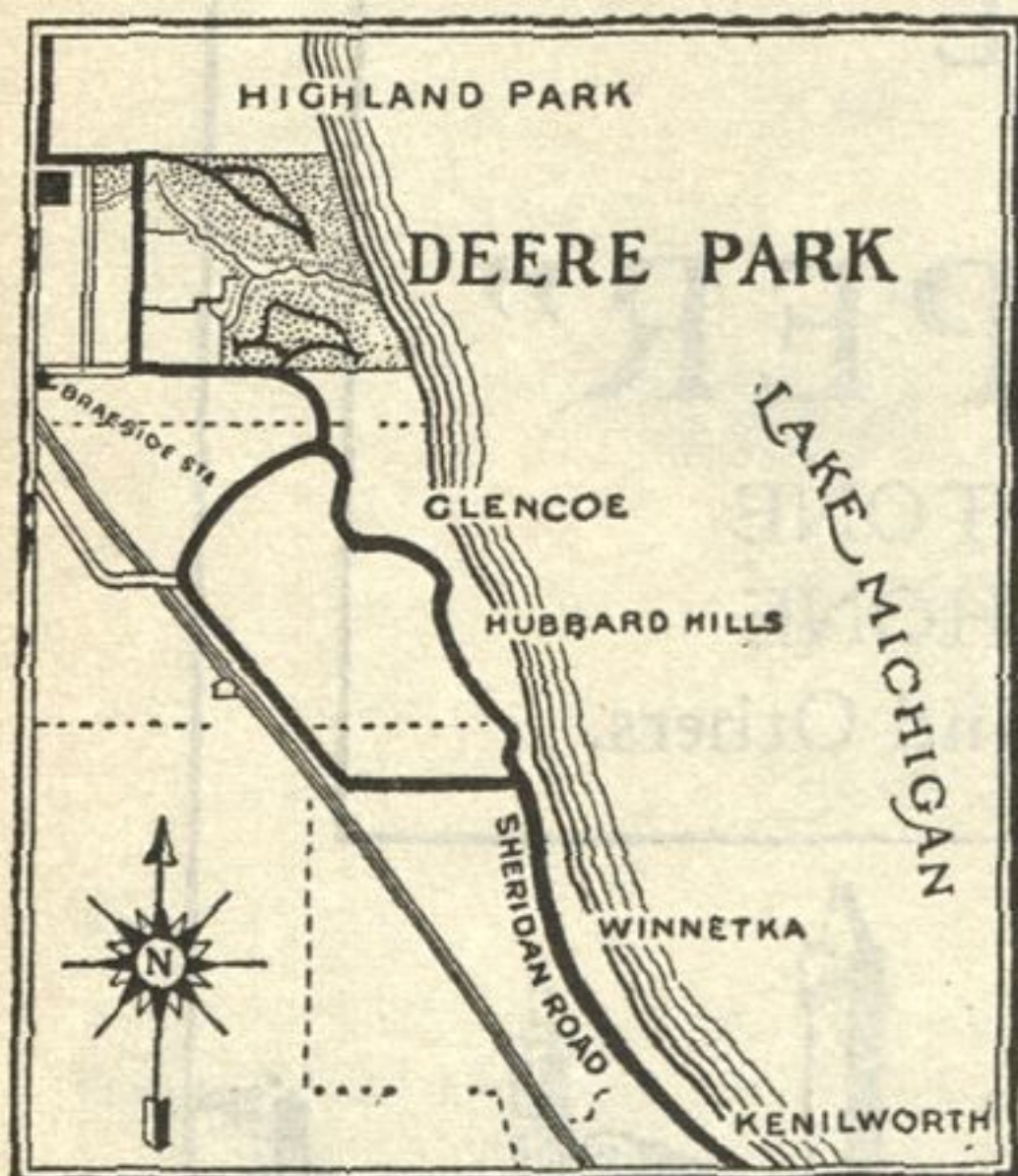
