Commencement Exercises at High School to be Held Thursday Evening, June 14

The largest graduating class in the history of New Trier high school will receive diplomas at the graduation exercises of the school next Thursday evening, June 14. The final list of graduates has not been made out, but about 320 will receive diplomas, it is stated.

This year's commencement exercises will be held in the new gymnasium at New Trier for the first time. The doors will open at 7:30, and reserved seats on the main floor which are not occupied by 8 o'clock will be re-sold.

Dr. Fred Eastman, of the Chicago Theological Seminary, is the commencement speaker. His subject will be "The Crowd and You."

The student musical organization will have a part in this year's program. This is a departure from the custom which has been followed in the past. Another change from the plan followed in previous years is the opening up of the balconies to the public. General admission tickets will be sold for the balcony, but there will be no reserved seats as on the main floor.

So far as it is known this year's class is the first in which the girls have outnumbered the boys.
