

**New Annapolis Head to Visit at Northwestern**

Rear-Admiral S. S. Robison, newly appointed superintendent of the United States Naval Academy, will visit Northwestern university Saturday, June 12, Commander S. B. McKinney of the naval unit of the R. O. T. C. has announced. He is making a tour of several of the outstanding universities of the country with a view to adapting some of their courses to the curriculum of the naval academy. Admiral Robison was graduated from the naval academy in 1888, and was made a rear-admiral in 1918. In 1917-18 he was commander of the submarine force of the Atlantic fleet. From 1923 to 1925 he was admiral in command of the battle fleet, and since 1925 has been admiral in command of the United States fleet.
