**Washburne to Teach Summer Classes at Minnesota University**  
Carleton Washburne, superintendent of the Winnetka Public schools, will conduct a demonstration school at the University of Minnesota this summer to train teachers in individual technique as it is practiced in the Winnetka schools. He will be assisted by Miss Hazel Hartwell, of the Horace Mann school, and by Miss Lila Graham and Mrs. Mildred Hughes, of the Hubbard Woods school. Miss Luella Swartz, teacher in the Hubbard Woods school, will spend the summer at her home in River Falls, Wis.


