**Help Scoutmasters, Parents Are Urged; Bulletin Tells How**

Many north shore scoutmasters are cooperating with Dr. Norman E. Richardson in research problems concerning the most effective application of the scout program. While the leaders of a scout troop have much to do with the development of a boy in his scout work, a large part of it rests upon the parents, it has been pointed out.

The research projects show the following ways in which parents can help the growth of a scout as outlined in a bulletin issued this week from the north shore council office.

1. Do not punish scouts by keeping them away from scout meetings. Such a procedure is as logical as depriving a boy of his meals or his school work.
2. Help your son by practicing the eighth scout law—a scout is cheerful.
3. Give your son a regular allowance and hold him responsible for saving it and spending it wisely.
4. Give him plenty of good books and magazines to read and he will not be interested in news stand filth.
5. Do not take the part of the boy when he is in the wrong and is criticizing his leaders unjustly.
6. Encourage the scoutmaster in the contribution which he is making to boy life.
- The scout uniform is an emblem, symbolic of scout ideals. Help your son to keep it clean and neat.
8. Cooperate with the scoutmaster in preventing tardiness and truancy.
9. Help him to select a few things to do well rather than many to dabble in.
10. Cooperate with him by giving him permission to go on over-night hikes and to camp.
11. Don't say that you are too busy to visit the troop and to carry your fair share of work on the troop committee.
12. Encourage your son in scouting advancement.
