

Sell Tickets Now for Sousa Band Concerts

Plans for the concerts to be given in Patten gymnasium on September 22 by Sousa and his band are progressing successfully, and numerous ticket sales, as well as reservations of seats, already have been made. 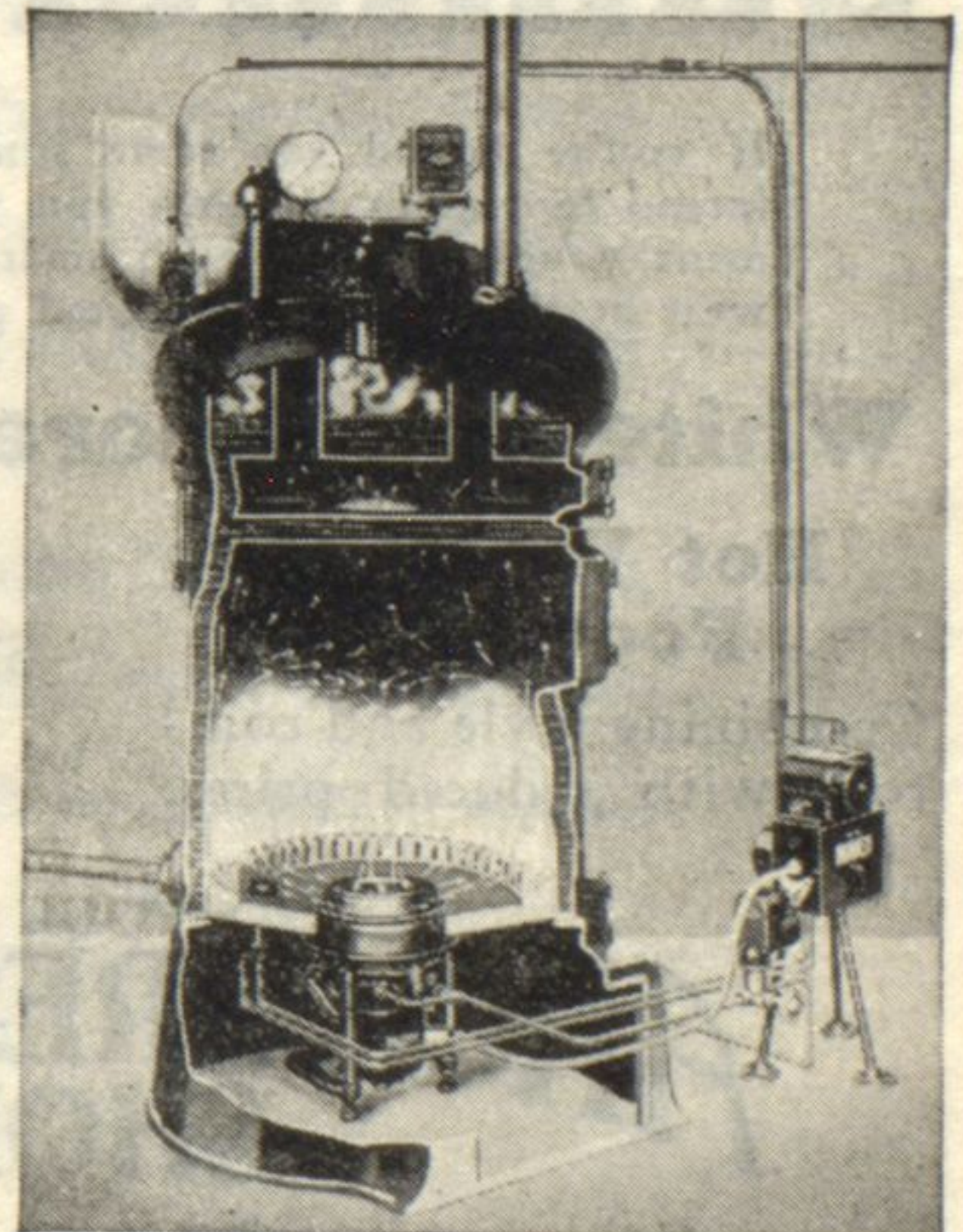
