Famous Lon Chaney Picture Will Be at Varsity Three Days

"The Blue Danube," Paul Sloane production starring Leatrice Joy and Joseph Schildkraut, is to be the Varsity theater attraction for this Saturday. The story in this picture is extremely human. Though not a war picture, the undercurrent of the World War is felt in several sequences and it stresses the tragedy of a proud nation suffering the pangs of galling defeat.
