Community House Will Show "Old Ironsides"

Like a mighty chord played to a stirring memory the guns of "Old Ironsides" thunder again. The old war-time picture will be shown on the Community House screen next Tuesday, July 17. Sashed pirates no longer roam the Mediterranean, but Stephen Decatur and the powder-grimed Yankee heroes of 1804 are not forgotten. Wallace Beery, George Bancroft, Johnnie Walker, Charles Farrell—and, of course, Esther Ralston—must feel signally honored. They play some of the principal roles in the picture.

To those who know Syd Chaplin only through the amusing female impersonations in "Charley's Aunt," "The Man on the Box," and "Oh! What a Nurse," we recommend a visit to the Community House next Friday, July 20, where he will play in the screen version of "The Better 'Ole." In this picture Syd is Old Bill, famous old soldier of the Bruce Bairnsfather cartoons. Adapted by Charles Reisner and Darryl Francis Zanuck from the stage play by Bairnsfather and Arthur Eliot, "The Better 'Ole" makes perfect screen material, and is excellently acted by a cast that includes Harold Goodwin, Doris Hill, Theodore Lorch, Ed Kennedy, Charles Gerrard, Tom McGuire, Jack Ackroyd, Tom Kennedy, K. Morgan, and Arthur Clayton. The production was directed by Charles Reisner, who used to write the gags for the Charlie Chaplin pictures.

Teatro del Lago to Show Reginald Denny Picture This Saturday

"Good Morning, Judge" with Reginald Denny in the principal is the first picture in the list of Teatro del Lago attractions for the week. It will be shown this Saturday, July 14. This new show of Denny's is a good one. Fast and foolish it is, and boasts some different and laugh provoking gags. As is customary, the star is seen as a rich young bachelor. In the present instance, however, he pulls a poor face, and, to intrigue the attention and sympathy of the girl he loves, pretends to be not only penniless but a criminal as well. This girl is Mary Nolan, charming blonde, who runs a mission.

Teeming with situations of refreshing originality, new gags, and a high degree of thrills and suspense, "Walking Back," a DeMille studio production featuring Sue Carol comes to the Teatro del Lago this Sunday, July 15. The plot deals with the most advanced type of high school boys and girls, showing both the dangers and the delights which are their peculiar heritage. Both sides of the picture are presented with equal frankness.

She marries one of them, Albert, impersonated in approved rascally fashion by Ben Bard; has a hard, hard time for a long, long while, and is finally set free by his death. We leave her, happily united with her faithful, waiting Maurice, rather neatly played by Don Alvarado.

Two men are responsible for the great success of "Laugh, Clown, Laugh," which is to be shown at the Teatro del Lago next Thursday and Friday. Lon Chaney, master of make-up and character, contributes what will probably go down in history as one of his greatest portrayals of the screen. Herbert Brenon, who gave the world "Beau Geste," "Peter Pan," and others, has reached the climax of his directorial talents. The story is the famous stage play. It is a romance of the theater—the unseen side, with Lon Chaney as the tragic clown, whose great love and even greater understanding of the heart of a woman impels the terrific sacrifice that marks the climax of the tale.
