

Winnetkans Loom as Championship New Trier Team

The Winnetka baseball team continued playing championship brand baseball and as a result handed Glencoe a defeat last Sunday by a score of 6 to 5. In a previous engagement between these two teams, Winnetka won by a similar score.

Playing in top form, the local outfit turned in three double plays to pull "Lefty" Mills out of some tight places. "Lefty," by the way, substituted for Jack Slattery, who pitched for the locals last Friday evening, when they defeated the T. J. Crowe Boosters at Welles park.

Getting back to Sunday's game, Winnetka stepped on Gore, Glencoe's pitching ace, for three runs in the first inning. Lindholm singled, and was moved along on Holleb's sacrifice. Then Izard, new third base addition to the local club, Bill Carey and "Fid" Runfieldt singled in succession and three runs crossed the pan.

Glencoe Goes Ahead

Glencoe came back with one in their half of the first, and added four more in the second, to forge ahead 5 to 3. Some heavy stick work combined with all the bad baseball that the locals pulled off all afternoon was crammed into this inning. The four runs, however, concluded the scoring for the Glencoe run-getters, and from this juncture to the finish "Lefty" had the enemy eating out of his hands. Some brilliant fielding, however, also assisted materially.

Winnetka kept nicking away at the illustrious Mr. Gore's offerings and picked up runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the count at 5 apiece.

Mills Gets a Hit

Things were very quiet for the next two innings and neither side managed

to place a man on first base. In the first of the eighth, Mr. Mills, who occasionally gets a safe blow, ramed a double to right. After some deliberation as to what to do, Johnnie Lindholm pulled a slow roller down the first base line. Mr. Gore made an attempt to get it, and so did Porky Glader, Glencoe's first sacker. Jack Brewer all this time was tearing in to retrieve the pellet and with an added burst of speed reached the ball before the other two. Picking it up, he reeled to throw to Gore, who by this time made an attempt to cover first. Brewer's throw was wide and by the time the ball had finally come to rest, Mills was home with the winning run, and Lindholm was camped on second.

In the last half of the ninth, Glencoe threatened. After one was gone, Bill Schroeder was hit by a pitched ball. He moved to second on a passed ball by Carey, and continued to third on an infield out. Frankie Hohlfelder was at bat, with the tying run on third. After working the count of three and two, Frankie rolled feebly to Izard at third and was thrown out, ending the contest.

The second round of the New Trier Township championship will be played in a few weeks. The Fairplay Sporting Goods company has offered a cup to the best team in New Trier township. To date Glencoe has won from Wilmette and lost to Winnetka. Glencoe and Wilmette will battle again Sunday at Wilmette, while Winnetka will take on the strong Woodlawn Athletic club from Chicago. The Winnetka game will be played on the Skokie Playfield diamond at Elm and Hubbard road. A large crowd is expected to turn out for the game to cheer the leaders in the New Trier Township Championship race. The present local club is perhaps the strongest baseball team that has represented Winnetka in the last decade.
