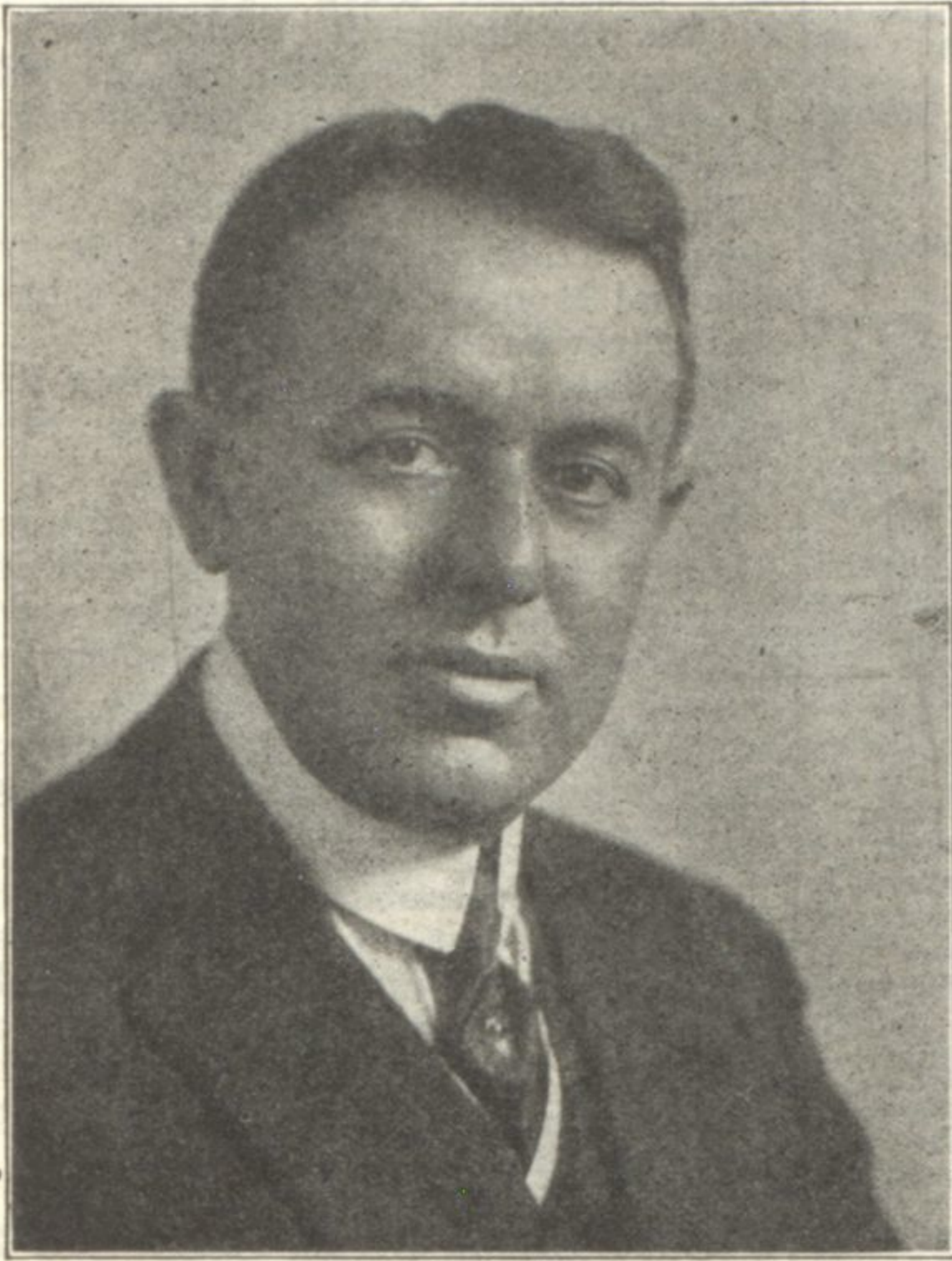


*Honored by Advertising Men*

W. Frank McClure, 219 Broadway, Wilmette, president of the Wilmette Sunday Evening club, was elected secretary of the International Advertising association at its annual convention in Detroit recently. This automatically makes him a member of the board of governors of the association.

Mr. McClure is one of the most widely known advertising men in the country. He has been prominent in the advertising field for many years and is now vice-president of the Albert Frank company, advertising agency, and in charge of the Chicago office.

It was largely through the efforts of Mr. McClure that the Wilmette Sunday Evening club has brought to the north shore outstanding leaders in religious, educational, and scientific fields, as well as internationally known musical organizations. He has been president of the club since its inception thirteen years ago and has been a prominent figure in Wilmette civic life during that time.
