FINISH STREET WORK

Resurfacing of Numerous Kenilworth Streets Practically Completed; Subscriptions Defray Cost

Re-surfacing work on several of Kenilworth's streets is practically completed. The work was begun the latter part of June by the Rock Road Construction company. An approximate total of more than 19,000 square yards of street surface has been improved. The cost of the work has been covered by subscriptions from abutting property owners.

Patching up of the holes in the streets was the first step in the process. A coat of tar was then put on and was covered with pea gravel, after which another coat of tar was applied. Grading with the road maintainer to provide a smooth wearing surface was


