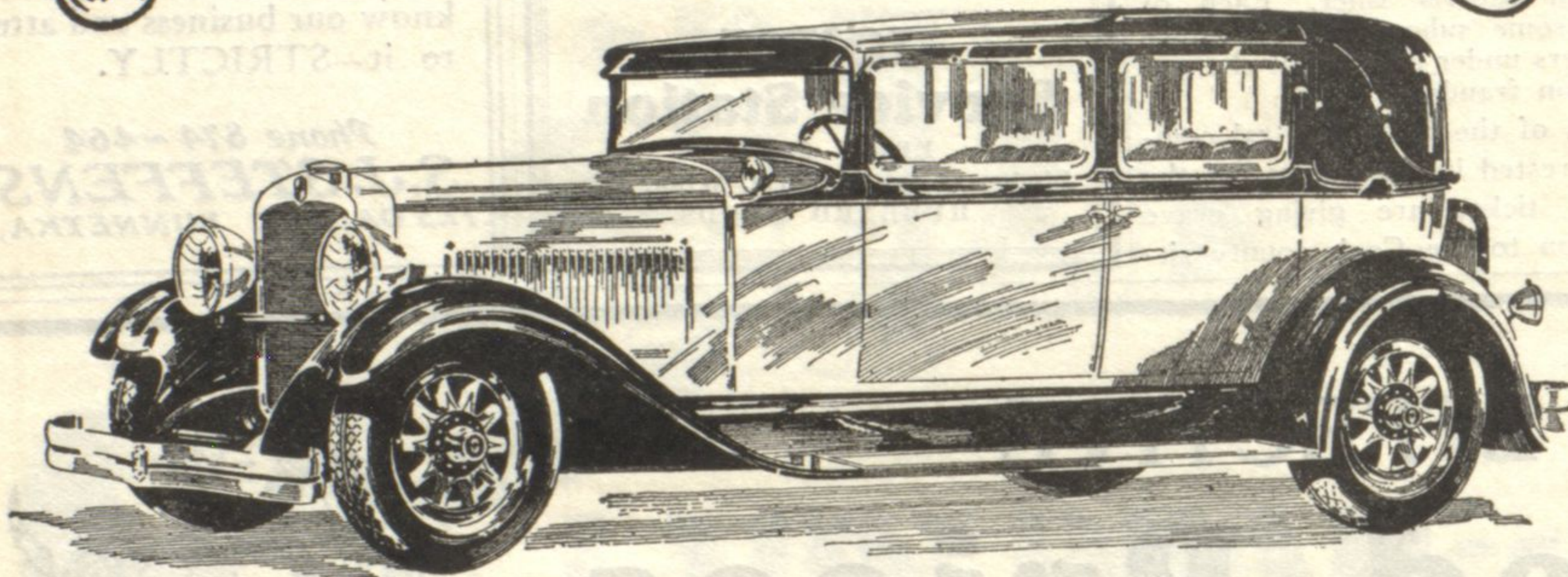
SHOWERS FOR BRIDE
