Negro Slayer Is Brought Here for Police Grilling

The Winnetka Village hall was the scene of considerable excitement last Monday evening, when David Shanks, negro, and self-confessed slayer of Miss Jennie Meta Constance, Northwestern university student, was brought here by Chief of Police William Freeman of Evanston, for questioning.

Shanks was trapped in Chicago where he had sold a watch which he took from his victim, and arrangements for bringing him to Winnetka for questioning were made with Chief of Police W. M. Peterson, by Chief Freeman who feared efforts might be made to lynch his prisoner were he to be taken to Evanston at that time.

The party arrived in Winnetka at 7:30 o'clock. A crowd of several hundred soon gathered and three hours later, when the Evanston and Chicago officials departed with their prisoner, the entrance to the Village Hall was blocked, necessitating an exit for the prisoner through a rear door of the building.
