Since his graduation from Michigan where he was captain of the football team he has been assistant grid coach at Northwestern. When it was decided to put a second team into the

field Coach Hanley appointed Steger to take charge of the squad.

The second team will open its season Oct. 6 in a game with Loyola varsity. The game will be played as part of a double header in which the Purple varsity will meet Butler. The Notre Dame second team will be the next opponent of the Wildcat reserves, the game to be played at Dyche stadium Oct. 20. This game will

also be part of a double header in which the varsity will clash with Kentucky.

Illinois reserves will be met in a game at Dyche stadium Oct. 27. On Nov. 10 the team will travel to Waukesha, Wis., for a game with the Carroll college varsity. The final game of the second team schedule will be with the Indiana reserves Nov. 17.
