William Haines Is Newspaper Reporter in Alcyon Picture

Vera Reynolds plays a leading role in "The Main Event," Pathe-DeMille picture to be shown at the Alcyon theater in Highland Park this Saturday, August 18. The acting in this picture is above par. The story is the old prize fight theme.

But Pete learns that being a policeman is more than wearing a uniform and a star. His chief, Mather, played by Alan Hale, puts him through a stiff course of training.

Pete's campaign against the gang of crooks is considerably complicated by his interest in its girl member, Mary Monks, played by Jacqueline Logan. There is plenty of action at the close of the picture when Pete goes after the gang in earnest to avenge the killing of his friend. The romantic element isn't overshadowed by the more violent affairs and the way is cleared very nicely for a happy ending, with Mary a policeman's bride instead of a gangman's little pal.
