

Cop Does Olympiad Vaults to Capture Fleeing Miscreant

The girl was Agnes Rogers, of 6322 Lakewood avenue, Chicago, who later in the day was permitted to return to her home accompanied by her mother.

Monday morning Schaffer was held to the Juvenile court, by Justice of the Peace R. E. Sinsheimer.

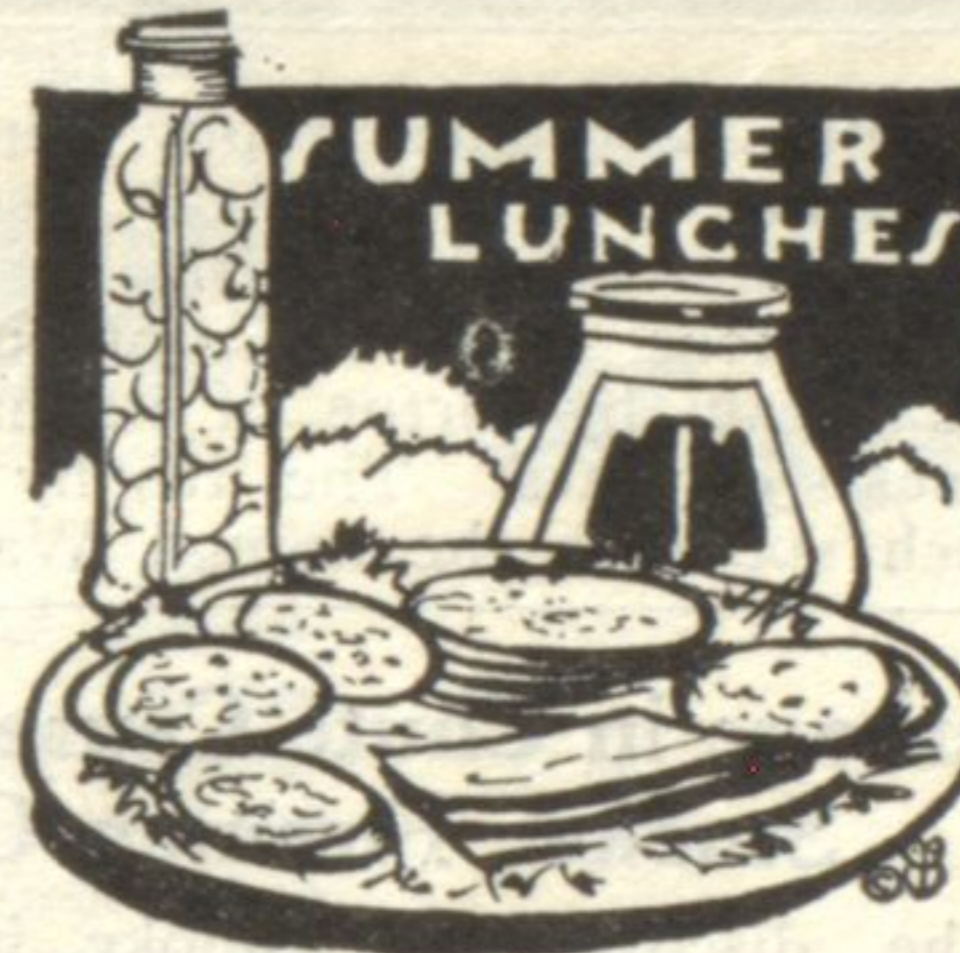

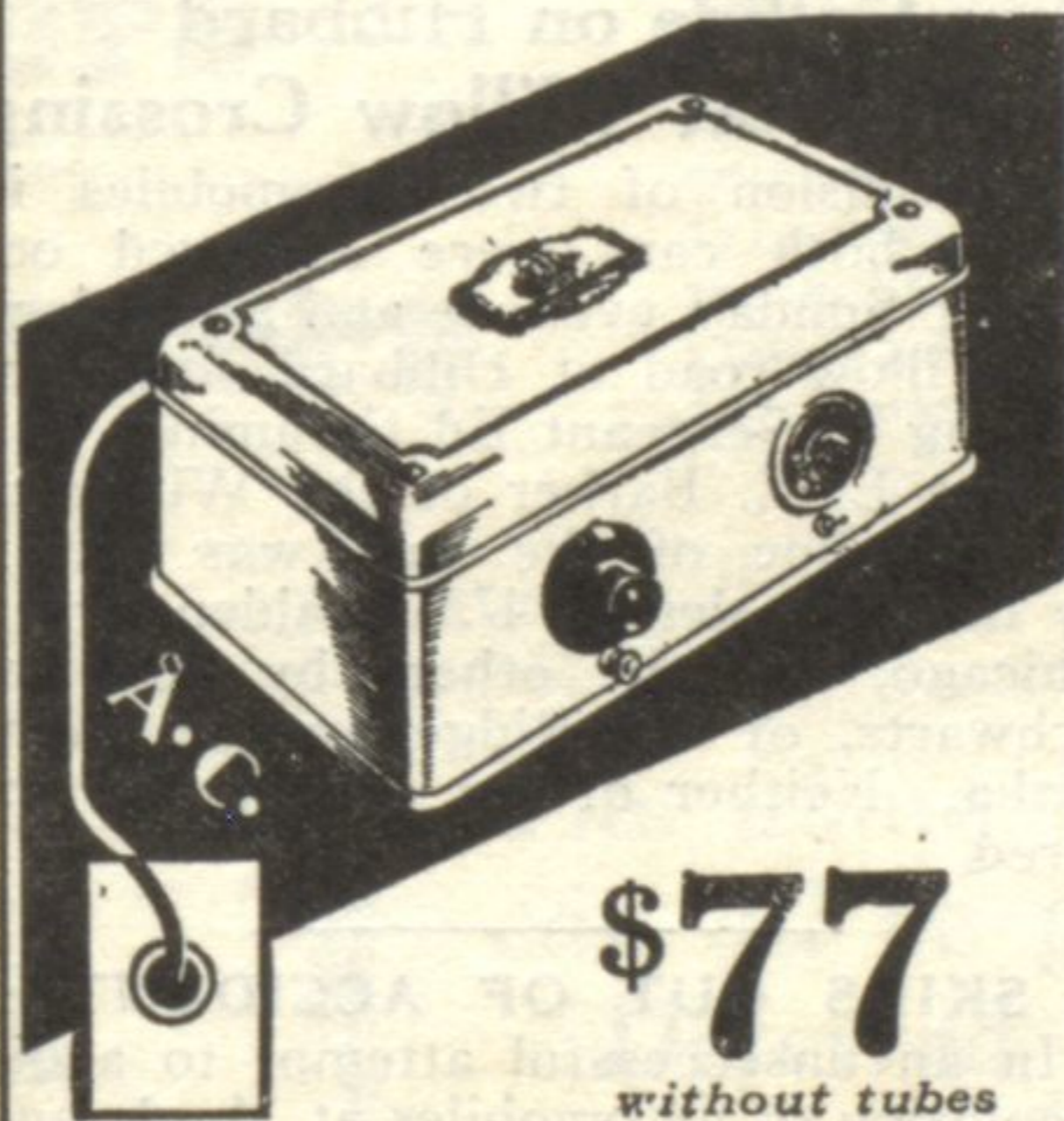
