Bills Realty Places Paving at Curb to Provide Lawn Space

A new idea in sidewalk location is being used in the Bills Realty company's Indian Hill estates. In order to give the residents a longer sweep of lawn and eliminate the unsightliness of trampled parkways, the sidewalks are being laid contiguous to the curb, rather than a few feet away as is the almost universal custom in residential districts.

People alighting from automobiles thus step directly onto the sidewalk instead of onto a grass plot, which is so easily ruined. These sidewalks are five feet wide.

Between 500 and 600 feet of street paving are being laid a day in the subdivision and already nearly a third of the property is provided with paved streets, according to Benjamin Bills, president of the company.

Twenty-six homes, ranging from an \$18,000 Cape Cod Colonial to a \$98,-000 English Tudor, are being completed there by purchasers of lots. Among those recently purchasing property in the subdivision are Mrs. Francis E. Ward, George H. Young, W. D. Norris and Marcus Mix.
