

Opens Tutor School

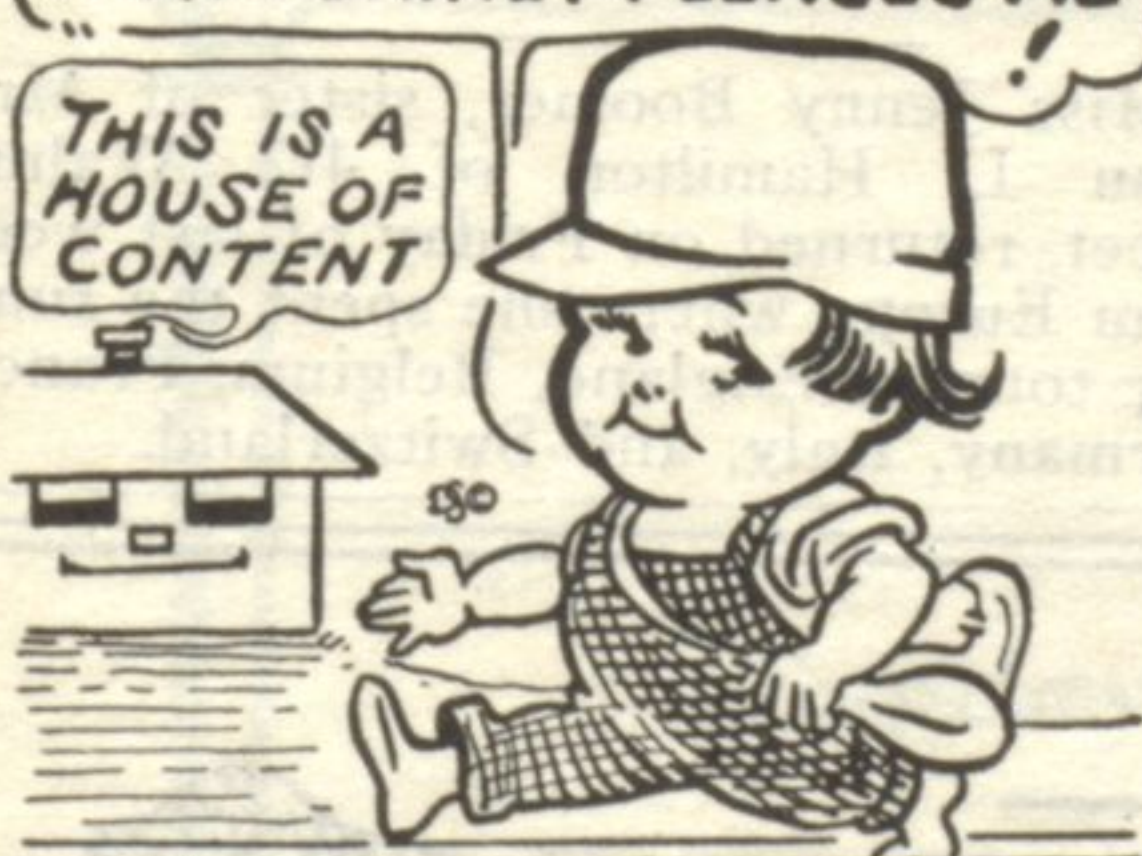
