

ORGANIZE FOR HOOVER

College Students to Be Lined Up for G. O. P., Directed by N. U. Grad

A group of representative Northwestern students attended the Hoover-Curtis college campaign dinner at the Union League club last Friday which marked the first steps to rouse student enthusiasm.

Eighteen schools were represented by the 75 men and women present who will head the volunteer committees in all colleges of any size in the middle west and west to obtain the college vote for Hoover. 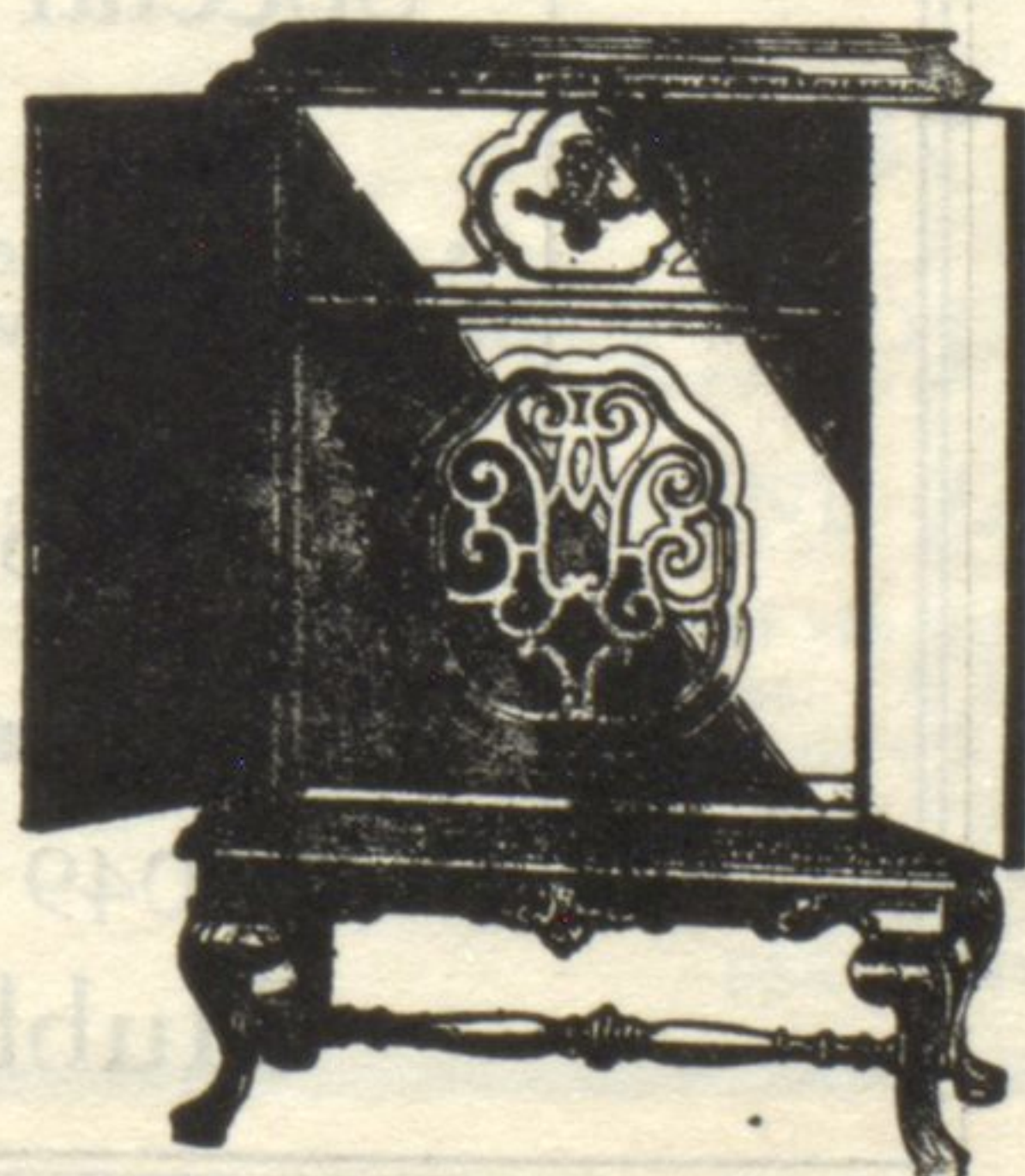
