North Shore Architects to Hear About Zoo Designing at First Meeting

Fall and winter activities of the North Shore Architects' association will begin in October.

The first meeting will be held Oct. 15. Edwin H. Clark, architect, will talk on the design of zoological parks. He is the architect for the new Chicago zoo, now being planned, and has just returned from Europe where he was sent by the zoological park association to study and inspect design in zoos abroad.

At the second meeting, to be held in November, Professor Emil Lorch, head of the department of architecture of the University of Michigan, will speak on "Modern Tendencies in Architecture." The regular annual meeting will be in December, at which officers will be elected for the coming year.

In January there will be a dinner and reception at the opening of the second annual architects' exhibition, given in co-operation with the University guild in the ballroom of the Orrington hotel. The exhibition will last the entire month.

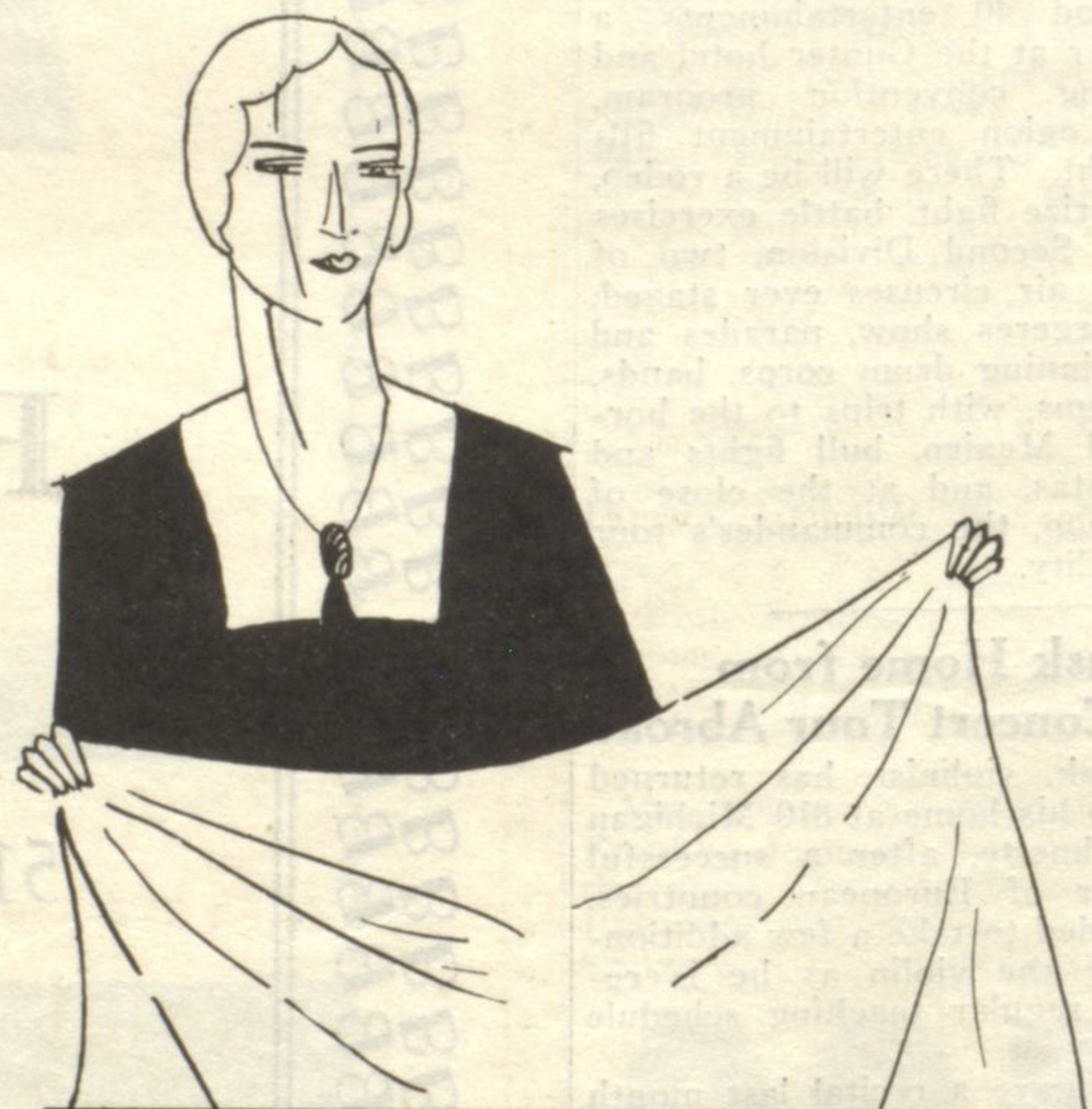
