For the week starting Sunday, Sep-  
tember 16, the Playhouse theatre will

End of St. Petersburg."

This film is a wonderful realistic  
record of the entire crash of the old  
Russian government. Pudowin, the  
director, has taken for his chief figure  
a bewildered youth, who goes to the  
city and becomes part of the great  
overturn. But the hero of the picture  
is really the mass of the Russian  
workers and farmers. The story is  
told violently, in sharp flashes, lashing  
at capitalism with irony and hate. The  
film catches the restlessness of a whole  
sullen people in the chaos of revolu-  
tion.

All the ingredients that go to make  
up a rib-cracking comedy, plentifully
