

Temporary "L" Trestle Will Be in Use Oct. 1

Operation of Rapid Transit line trains over the temporary northbound forth's Katydid; John Dennison in his trestle between Church and Isabella streets, Evanston, will begin October 1, gineer in charge of the "L" track elevation project. Work on the erection of the temporary south bound trestle is now in progress, and it is expected to have trains operating over this section of the temporary "high line" by November 1, Mr. Howard stated.

Construction of the permanent embankment will proceed after the completion of the temporary trestle work. This includes placing concrete retaining walls, building viaducts over street crossings, filling in the permanent right-of-way, erecting stations and laying permanent tracks.
