A building delay was caused by litigation with the city over zoning regulations, but the work is now well under way and approximately \$400,000 of the \$750,000 needed to complete the plan, has been raised. Completion of the building fund will be undertaken shortly, authorities announce.

Classes of the seminary will reopen in October at St. Mark's church, Garrett institute and Northwestern university.




