With this thought in mind Community House requests anyone who is so interested to communicate with some member of the staff at an early date, specifying in what particular line or lines of work he is interested.

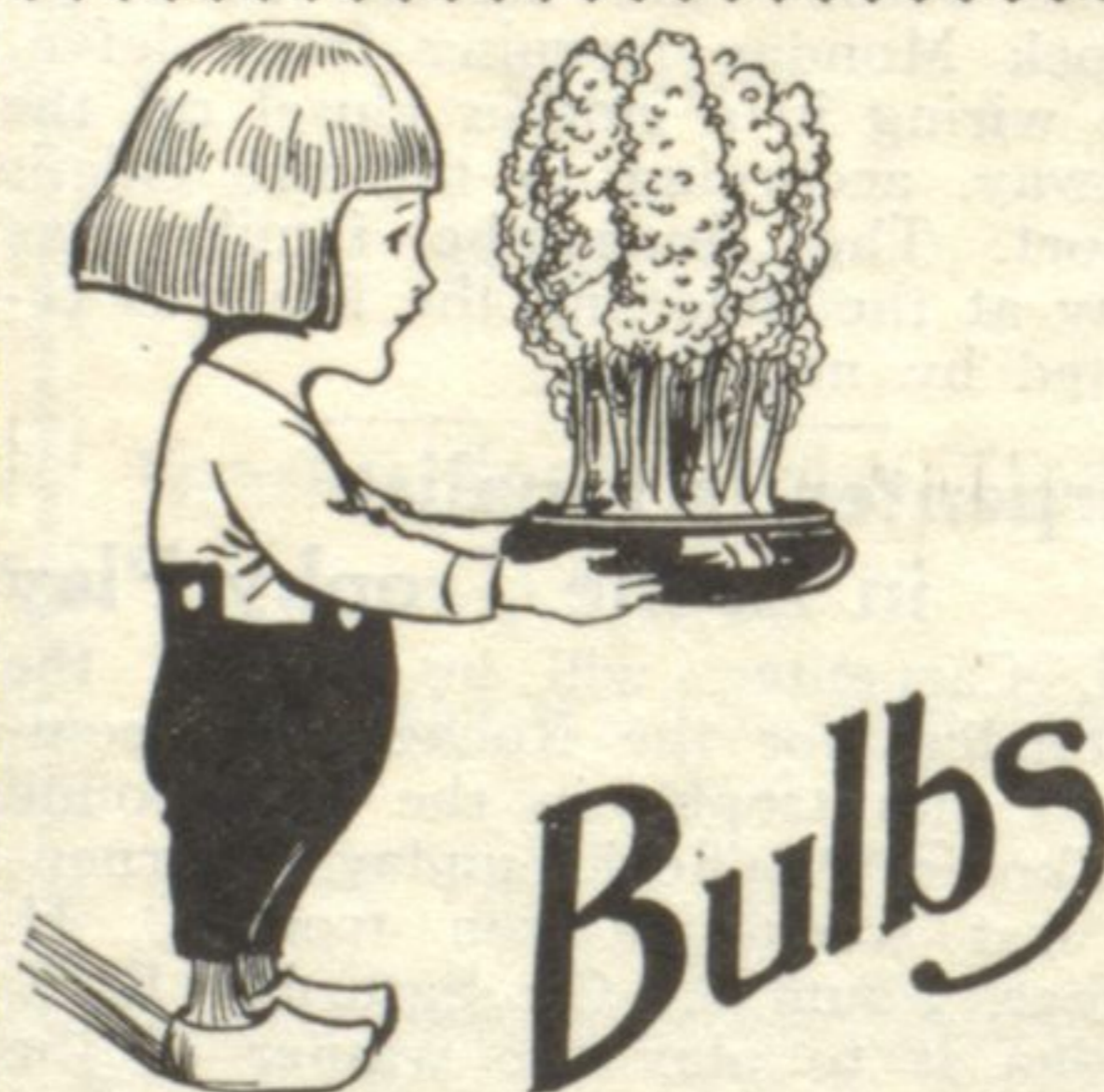
Room in Basement
