
Bird's-Eye View of New North Shore Sewage Treatment Plant



The sanitary district's mammoth north side sewage treatment plant at Oakton street and McCormick boulevard has been opened. This plant serves all the territory in Cook county between Fullerton avenue and the north boundary of the county. This picture shows a bird's-eye view of the plant. 1. is the main pumping station and blower house, 2. is the uotdoor sub-station, 3. the grit chamber and coarse screen house, 4. the preliminary settling tanks, 5. the aeration tanks, 6. the final settling tanks, 7. the operating galleries, 8. the main building, 9. the service building, 10. the drainage canal, which will no more carry untreated sewage, 11. is McCormick boulevard, 12. is Howard street, 13. is the C. & N. W. railroad and 14. is the "L."


In the evening the president's reception and the annual ball were held in the chamber of commerce ballroom.


Final Sessions Today


