October 17, 1928.

Dear Parents:

By arrangement of the Parent-Teacher association Monday evening, October 22, will be "parents' night" at Skokie school. In order that you and all of your child's teachers may become acquainted, or better acquainted, and that you may see how the school is organized and operated, a day's schedule will be carried out in miniature with children's parents passing from class to class instead of the pupils. Will you not come?

In the front hall you will be given your child's Monday schedule, which you will follow through. As the first period begins at 7:20 sharp, you should arrive by 7:10 in order to be on time at the first class. It would be sad to be sent

to the office for an admit slip so early in the game!

Periods will be ten minutes in length instead of the usual thirty. As most of the classes meet regularly double periods (60 minutes) all periods Monday evening will be for twenty minutes, with the exception of advisory, study hall, library, typewriting, biology and current events, writer's club, and music, which will last ten minutes only. Since the class periods are very short, it will be necessary to press briskly from one to another as soon as the bell rings. There will be opportunity in the gymnasium later for private conversation with teachers.

After the last class, all will gather socially in the gymnasium. On your way there you will go through "the lunch line" for light refreshments.

Children are expected to return to their advisers an acknowledgement of the receipt of this notice.
