## BUSHMAN AT GRANADA

Screen Star Will Appear in Person  
in Charles Kaley's New Show,  
"Sparkles of 1928"

One of the most impressive figures in screen history, an actor who is universally known for his work of the last fifteen years, Francis X. Bushman, will appear in person at the Granada theater in the Greater Show season program for the week starting this Saturday, October 20. He will follow Miss Patricola and star in Charles Kaley's "Sparkles of 1928."

Mr. Bushman is the hero of "Graustark," the motion picture based on the famous novel by George Barr McCutcheon. In recent months he received the applause of the entire motion picture public for his characterization of "Messala" in "Ben Hur." Apart from his fame as a screen idol, he is an athlete, sculptor, hunter, and an artist model. He is a Chicago star whose first work was with Essanay on the north side. His personal appearance with his own company is in an act reported to be original and entertaining.

Conrad Nagel and May McAvoy, whose speaking voices are already proved by performances in previous talking photoplays, come to the Granada in "Caught in the Fog," a Vitaphone synchronized mystery drama.
