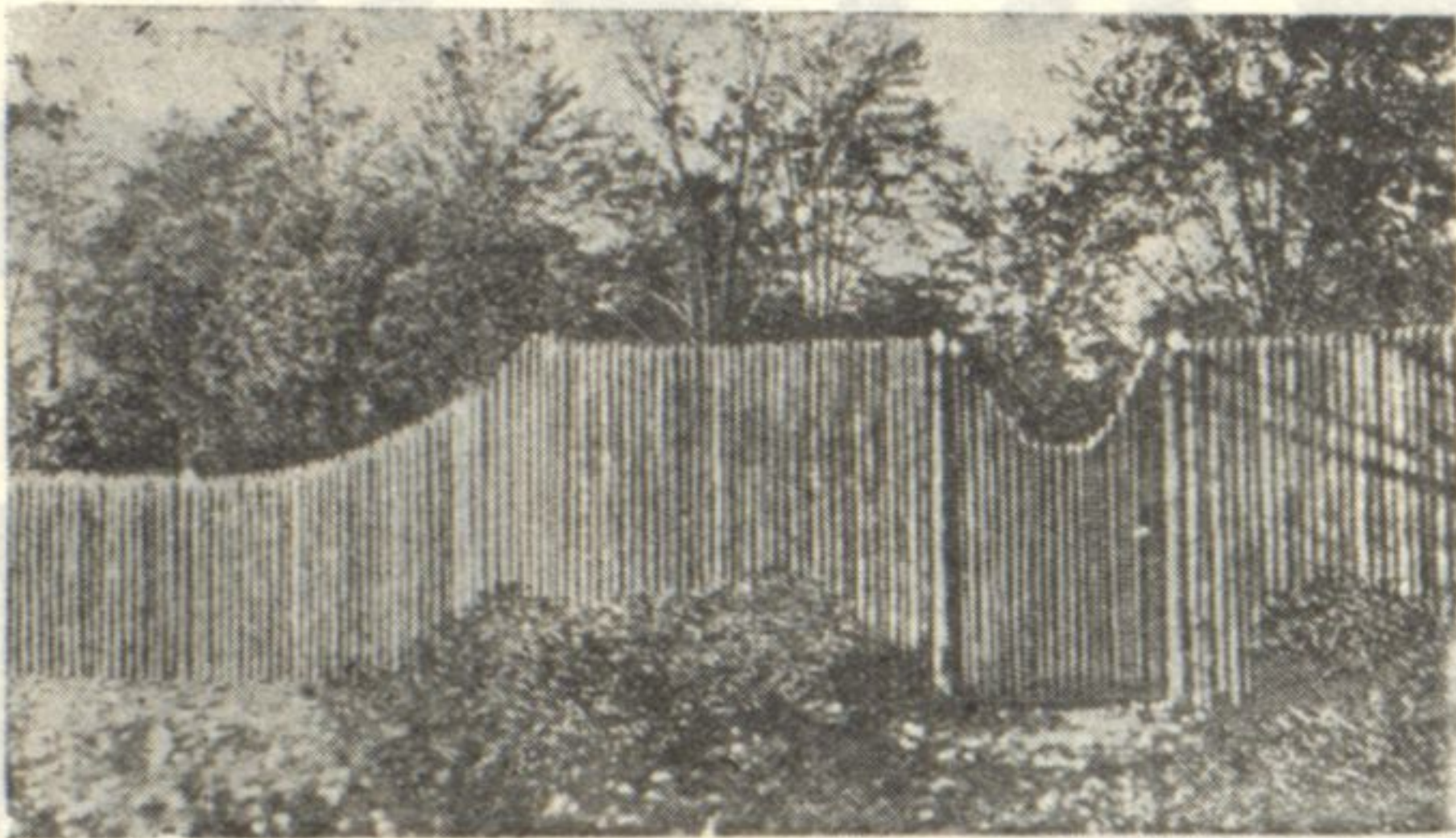
Kenilworth Scout Group Wins High Rally Honors

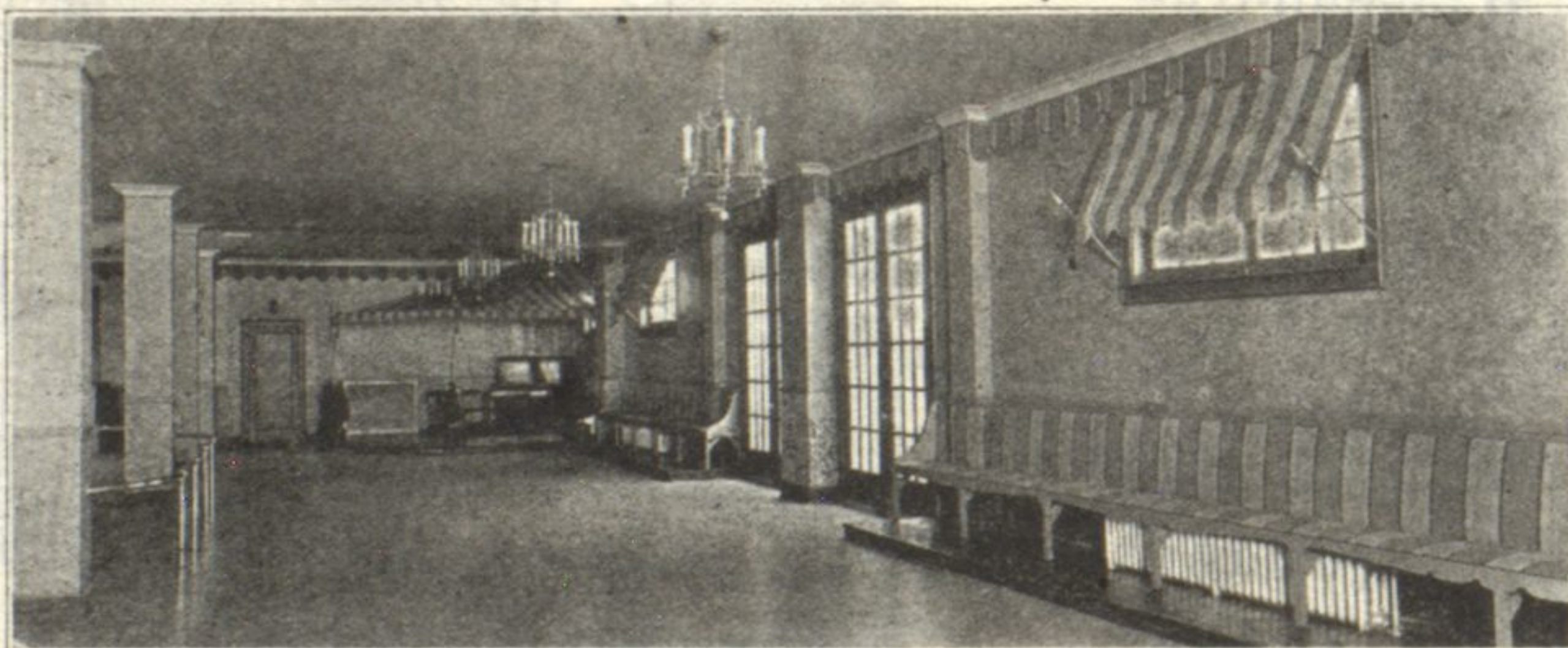
Junior Hikers Organize for Season's Activities
