The plant is at McCormick Road and Howard Street and now takes care of the needs of approximately a million people, north of Fullerton Avenue and beyond the limits of the city of Chicago, including Evanston and other large suburban municipalities. Furthermore, the great plant, built at a cost of \$32,000,000, is inoffensive, being practically odorless.

While this marvelous example of applied scientific sanitary practice, on

an unprecedented scale, establishes Chicago and areas beyond its confines within the jurisdiction of the Sanitary Board more firmly as the world's most healthy metropolitan district, it has achieved much more. It has the added
