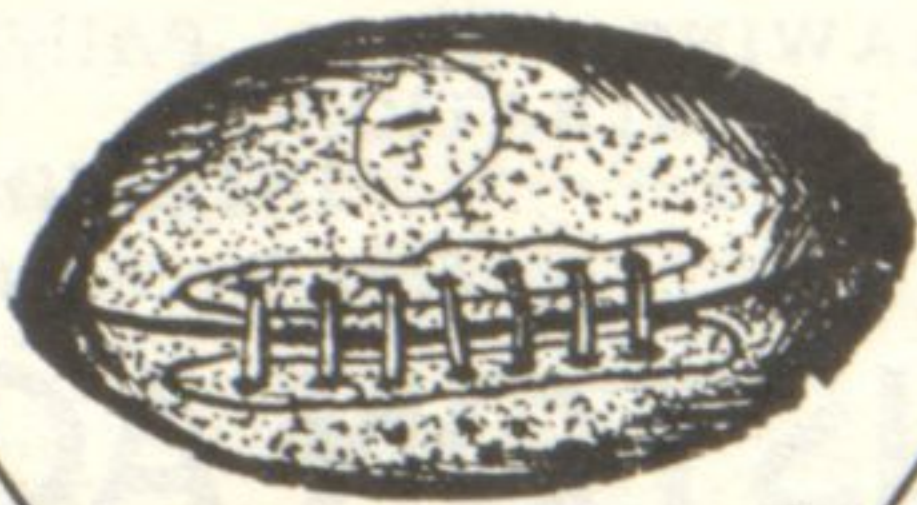

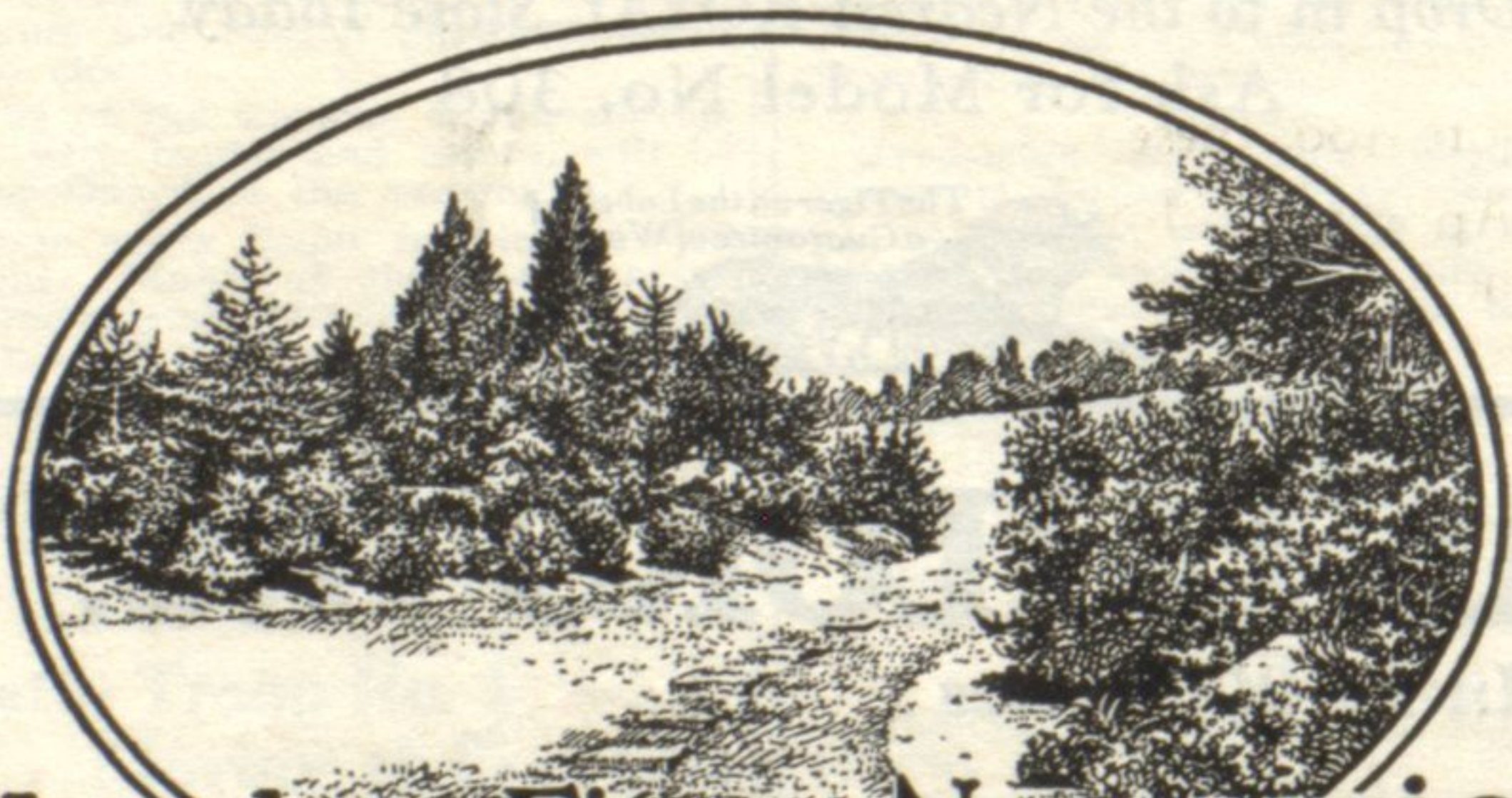

Sanitary District Acts to Clean Up DesPlaines

Completely to remove sewage pollution from the Des Plaines river and restore to the valley its former wholesomeness and charm, the Sanitary trustees under the leadership of President T. J. Crowe this week approved plans for a gigantic intercepting sewer running from the city of Des Plaines to Roosevelt road.

The huge artery will cost \$4,000,000 and will collect the sewage of the towns of DesPlaines, River Grove, Park Ridge, Franklin Park and Elmwood Park. The trustees also authorized a sewer running east on Howard street to the North Side treatment plant providing an outlet for Niles and Morton Grove.

The action of the board marks the culmination of several years' campaign on the part of the Izaak Walton league to clean up the Des Plaines river. Several leaders of the league were present at the board meeting and expressed their satisfaction at the adoption of President Crowe's program. This week groups of surveyors started to lay out the project.
