

Car and Ambulance Crash at Prospect and Tower

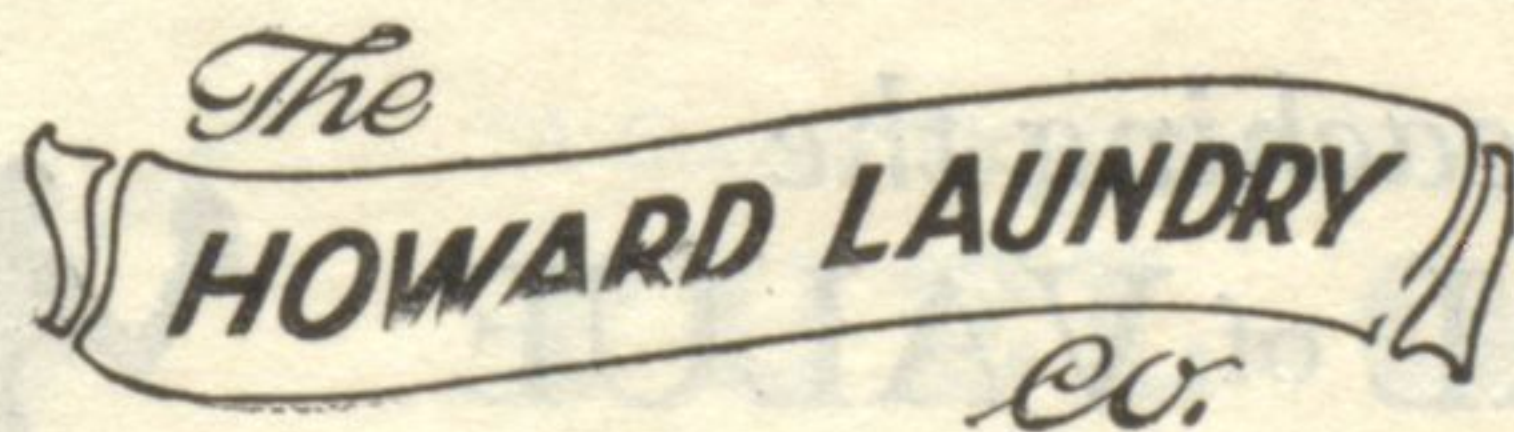
