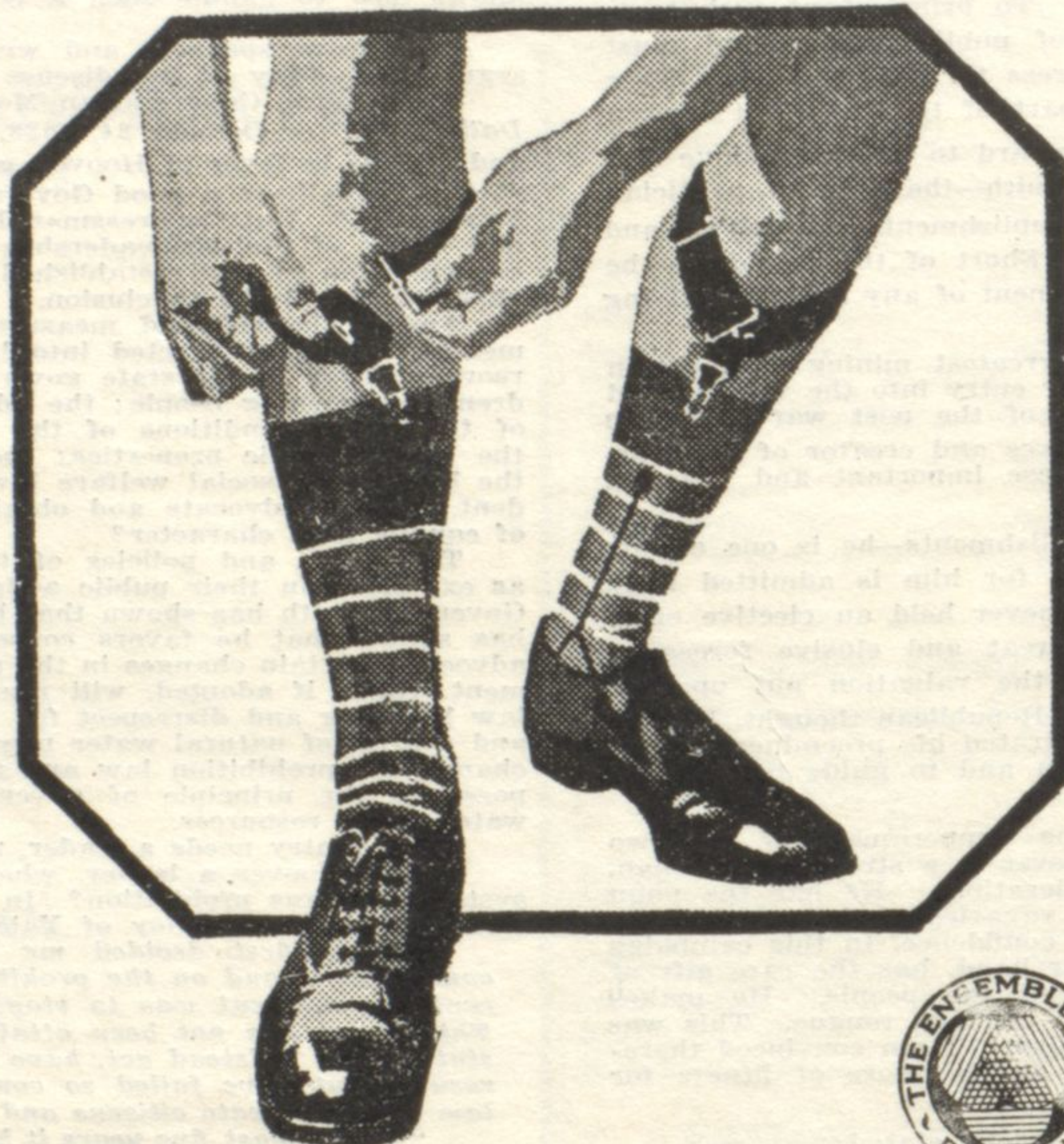
Schools Prepare for Mock Ballot on Election Day
