The game last Sunday was a 7 to 0 victory over the Chicago Kiwanis. The visitors came out expecting to avenge a 6 to 3 loss which they sustained at the hands of the Winnetka team last year.

The game was closely contested throughout, but Winnetka managed to score in the first five minutes of play. The passing combination of Martin and Jackett resulted in bringing the oval to the visitors' five yard line, when Concidine went over on two suc-

cessful line smashes.

Jackett's stellar playing was given deserved applause from the stands by the players and especially by an unexpected visitor.

However, the glory of another Winnetka victory was not to be had until the final whistle blew, as the visitors made a determined march down the field to Winnetka's 10 yard line, where they were held for downs.

The Winnetka team, as a whole, played a fine brand of ball and was in the fighting every second of play. The public is urged to come out and witness the game Sunday.

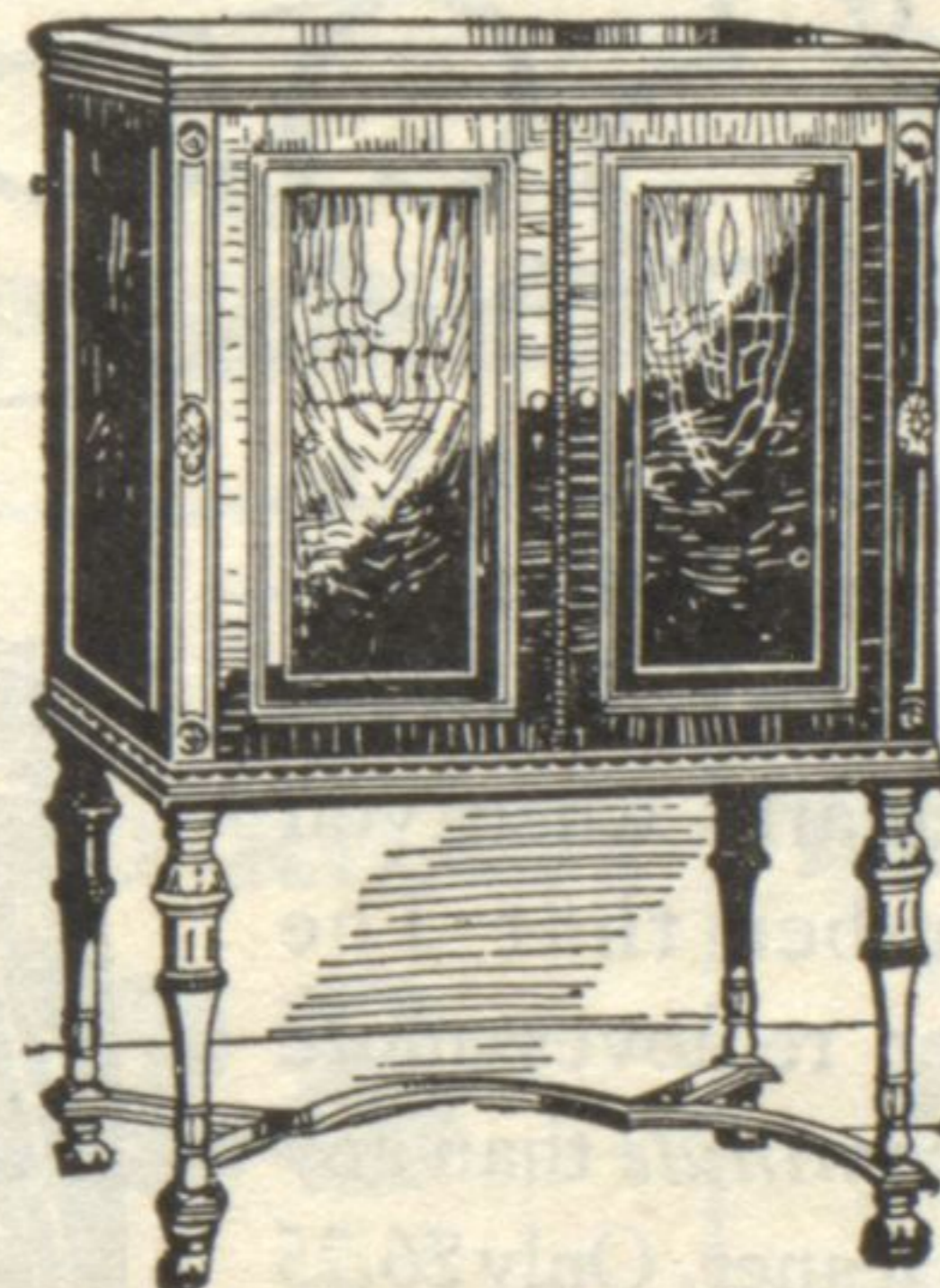
