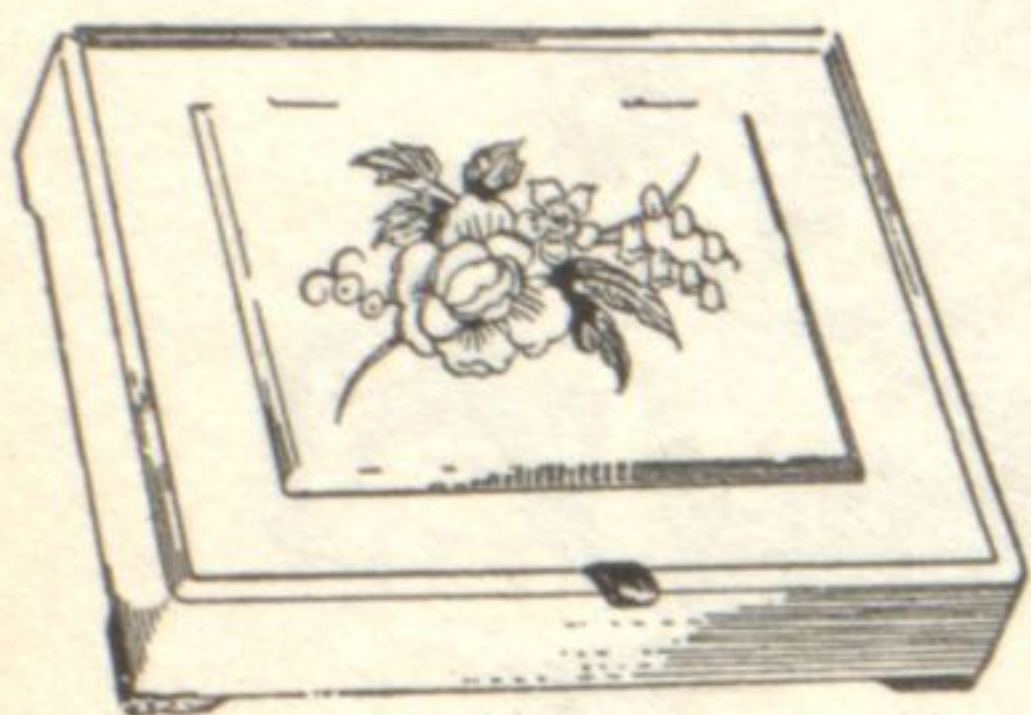

At Lincoln on November 1, she will speak before the normal training group on "Children's Interests in Literature," and before 1500 members of the Rural Teachers institute on "Present Trends in Childhood Education."

Miss Baker will speak on this same subject before the primary kindergarten section of the association in Omaha on November 2, and to the intermediate group on recent scientific studies in the teaching of reading.

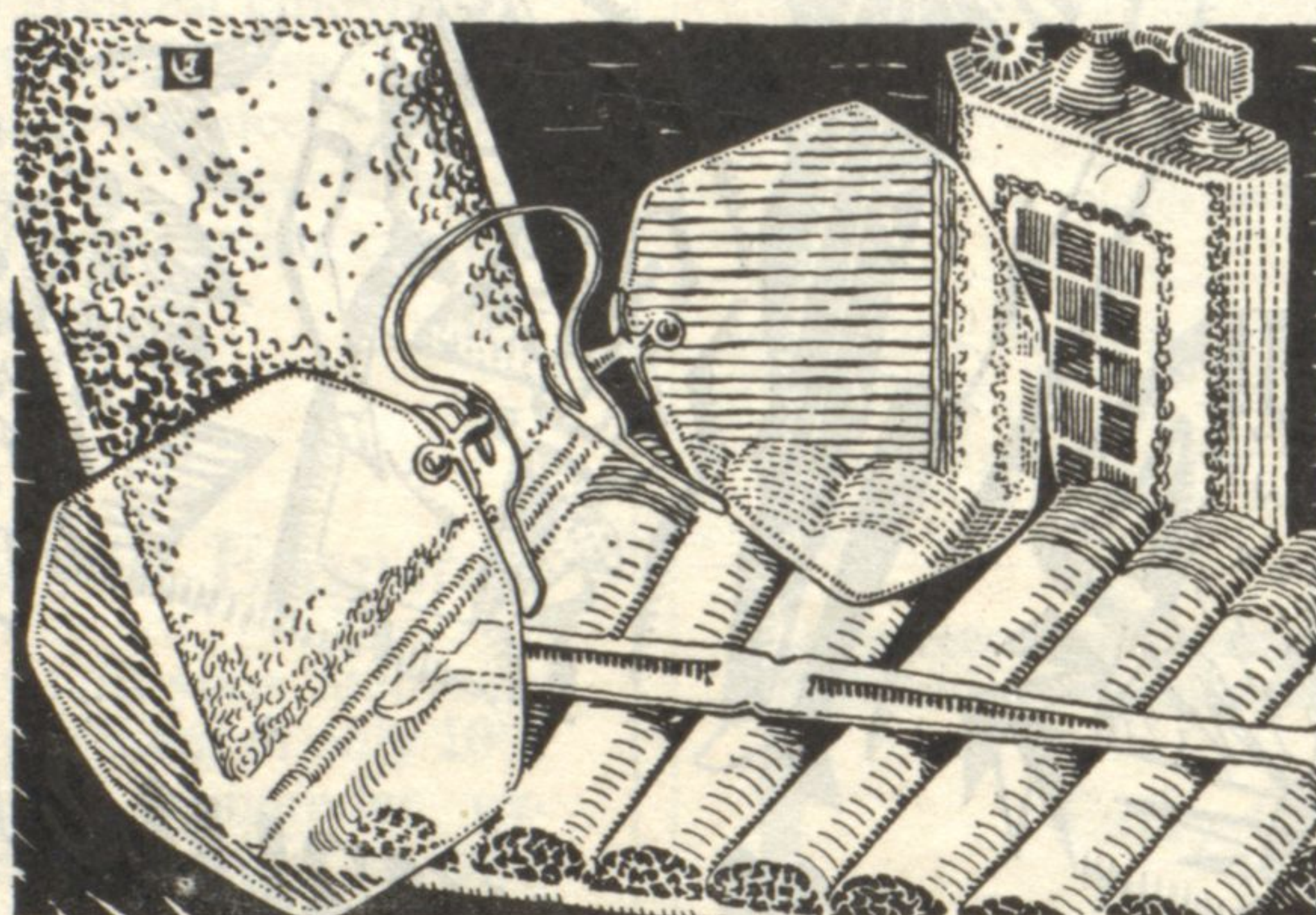
