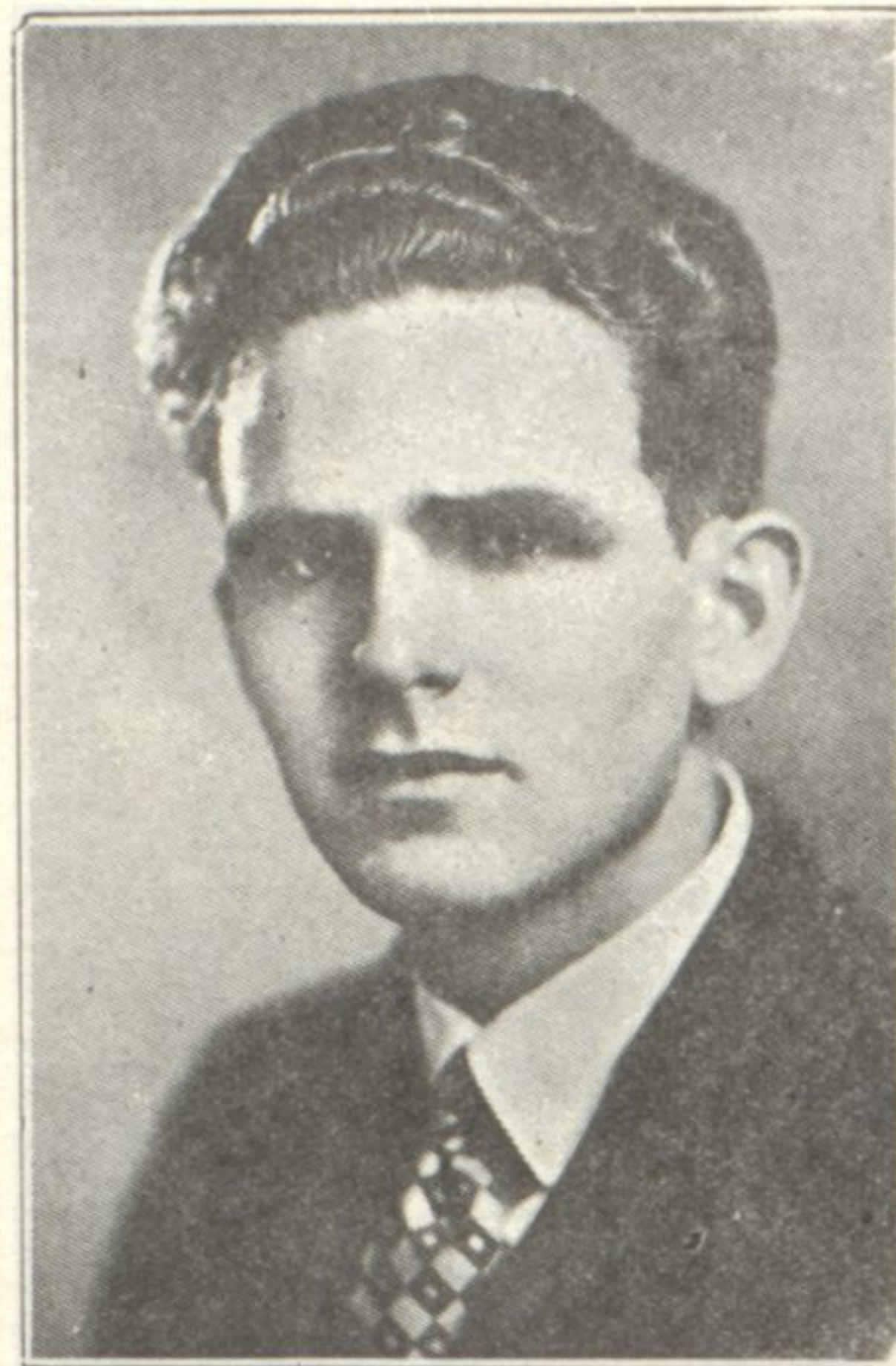

R. H. Shiley of Wilmette purchased the 6 room home at 219 Ninth street from W. S. Ballard.

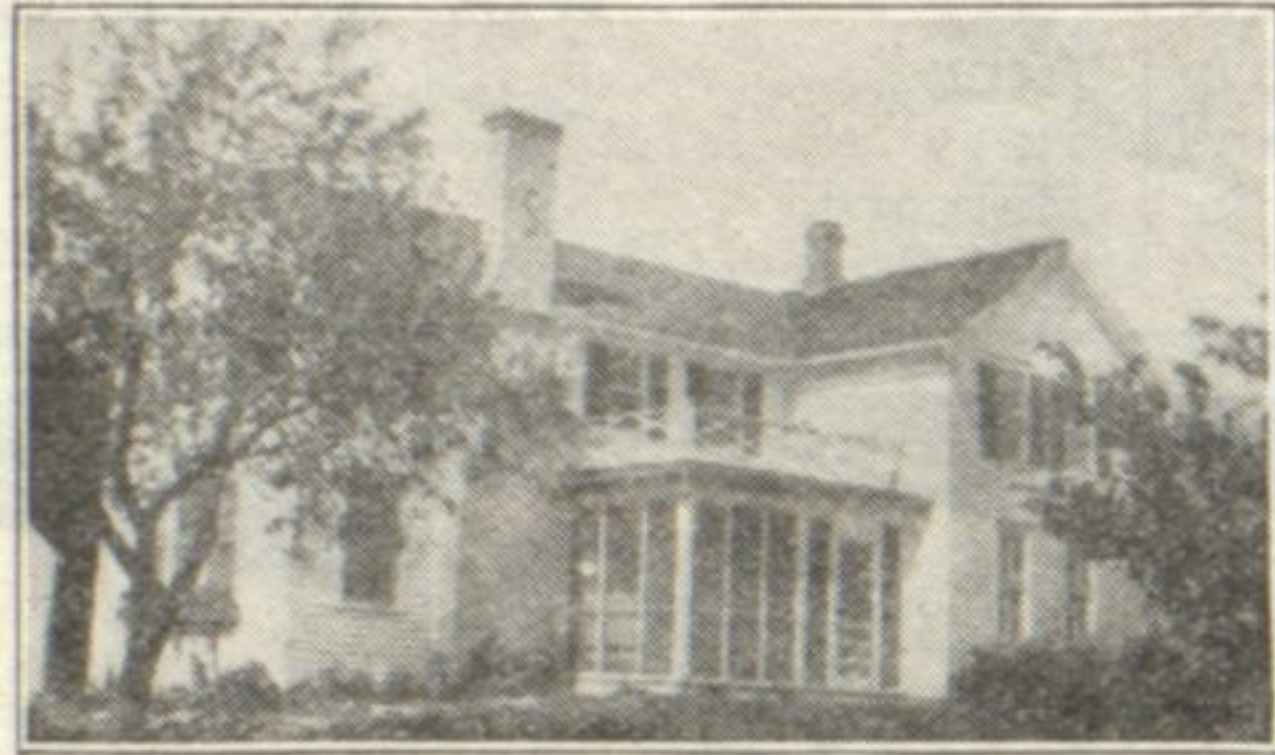
The Phillip Maher home on Sunset road, Winnetka, containing six rooms, was bought by S. Van T. Jester of Chicago.

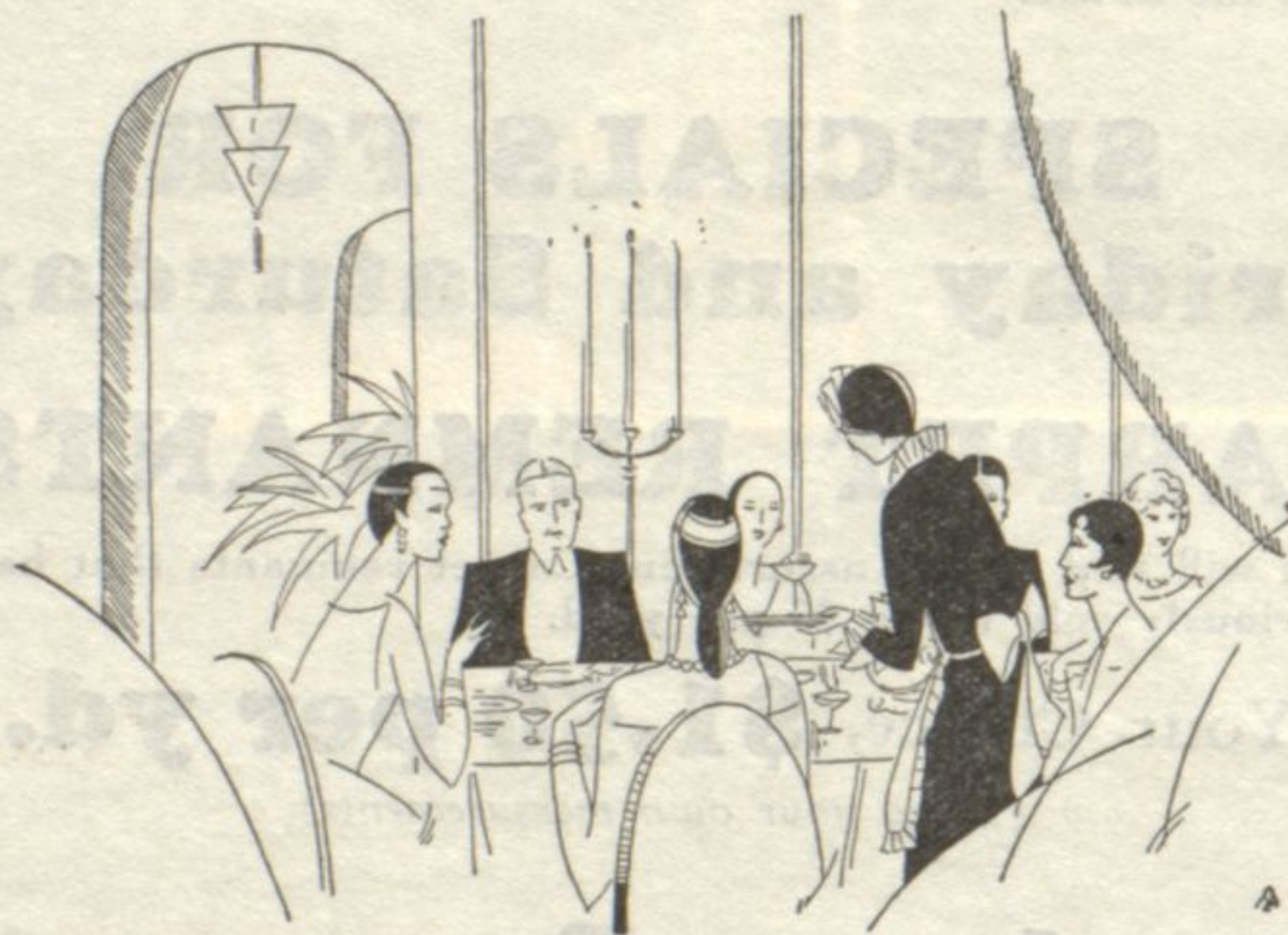
