

### Begin Construction of Four More Fine Indian Hill Homes

With the beginning of this week, the construction of four more fine homes in Indian Hill Estates has begun.

On Mohawk Road in Indian Hill Estates, a home of English design developed by the architect, George Fred Keck, is being constructed by Bills Bros., Inc., and is under way for Mr. Robt. W. Dierker of Winnetka, Ill. The exterior will be of brick and timber, slate roof, the interior enjoying an L-shaped design which has become so popular in its permission of sunlight and air. Different levels for different rooms are being provided—a story and one-half reception hall is a further feature. Construction circles are commending the fact that Bills Bros., Inc., on the first day of building, not only dug the full basement for this home, but also placed in all of the concrete footings.

William C. Black, 2300 Lincolnwood drive, Evanston, is having William Hemphill begin the construction this week of a home, also of English design, on his acre-and-a-half on Ramona Road. This home has the length of some 92-feet and will be one of the finer homes in the Estates section. Occupancy is planned for May 1, 1929.

George F. Gonsalves is beginning two homes for private owners on Seneca road—one will be in stone and of Colonial design; the other will be of English design in brick—one home having eight rooms, and the other home having nine rooms.

Directly across and to the north, immediately adjoining Indian Hill Estates, Thomas Coy of Evanston is beginning construction of an \$80,000 home for Mr. Chester Ericson of Gorrell and company—another delightful

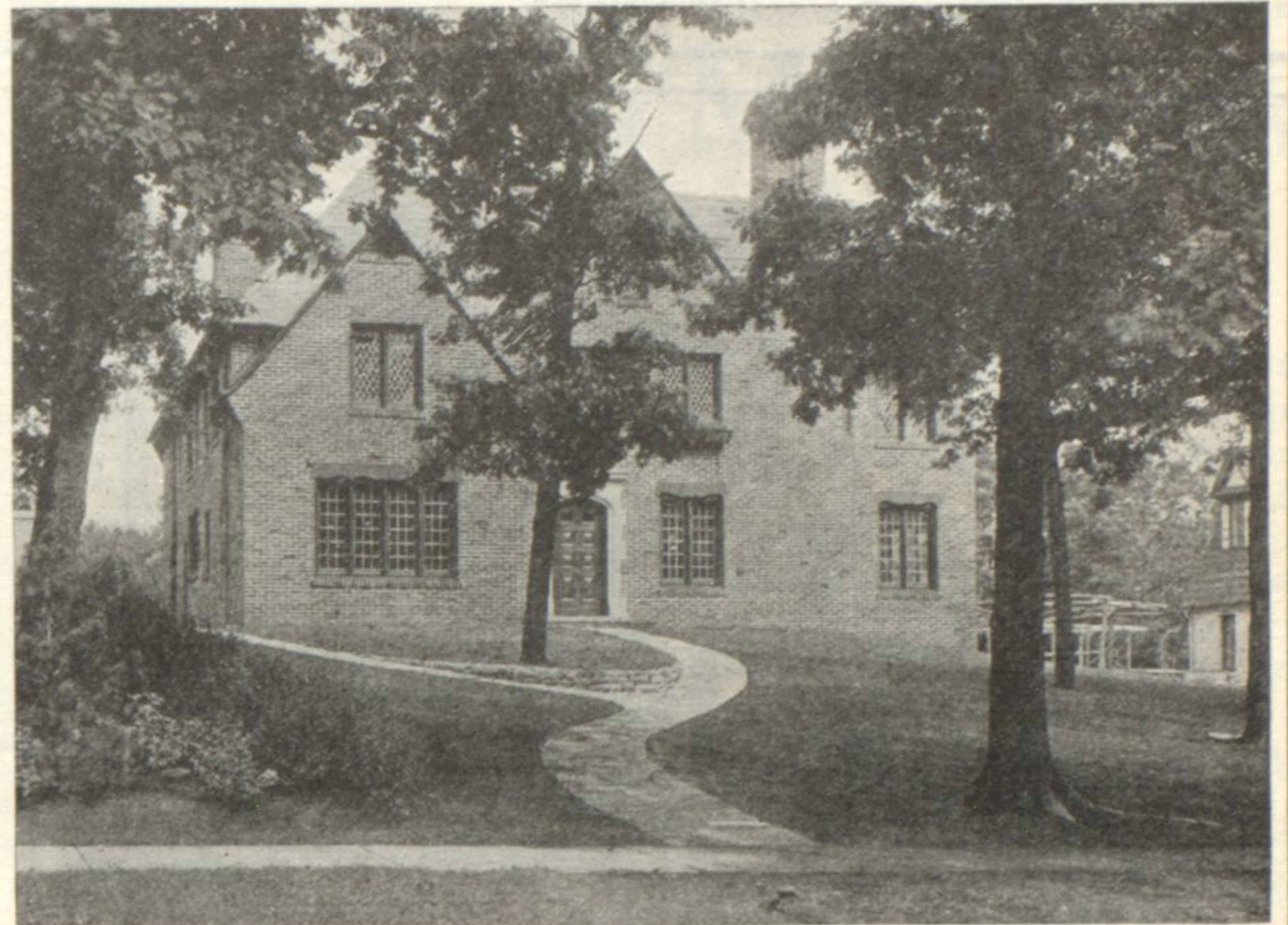

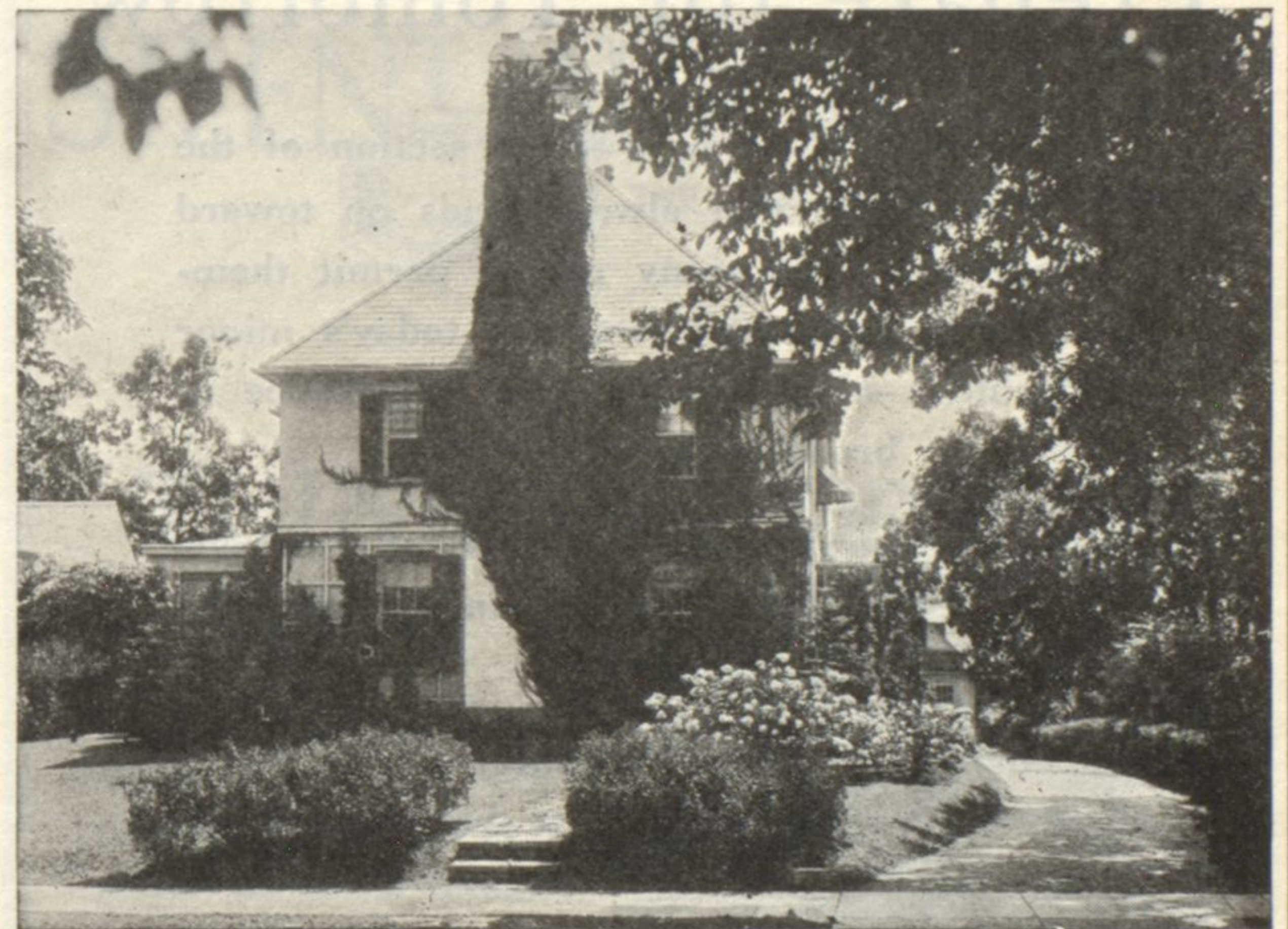

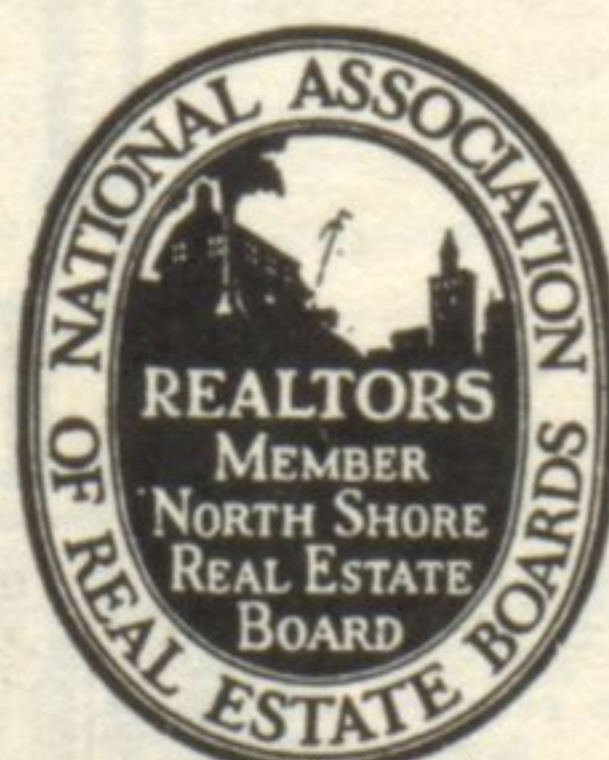
