"Caught in the Fog" to Be at Varsity Next Week

The Varsity theater in Evanston continues its showing of sound pictures. "The Tempest," with John Barrymore and Camilla Horn, is the present attraction. This picture, which movie critics and movie magazines have praised as one of the best this year, is built around a poor Russian peasant and a haughty princess. The action, of which there is aplenty, covers the last days of the czar's regime, the war, and the Red rebellion. Mr. Barrymore does not disappoint us in the frequent views of his profile. Miss Horn, the German girl who was brought to Hollywood after her appearance in "Faust" and "Metropolis," is lovely to look at and a splendid actress.

"Caught in the Fog," with Conrad Nagel and May McAvoy is the Varsity picture for next Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. The film is a comedy-mystery affair. Action takes place on a houseboat, unoccupied until various parties appear in quest of jewels known to repose in the vessel's safe. Masquerading under false identities, the visitors have a lot of excitement. Miss McAvoy and Mr. Nagel make an attractive team. The supporting roles are satisfactorily played.
