She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Dakin, with whom she lived in Evanston, and Mrs. Robert Cluett, of 1147 Sheridan road, Hubbard Woods. Two granddaughters, Mrs. Frederick H. Scott, wife of an official of Carson, Pirie, Scott company, and Mrs. Richard A. Conkling, and a grandson, Francis Dakin, represent the third generation. There are several great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at the Dakin home in Evanston Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Burial was at

Rosehill.
