Business Club Opens Meeting for a Talk by Mary E. Bailey

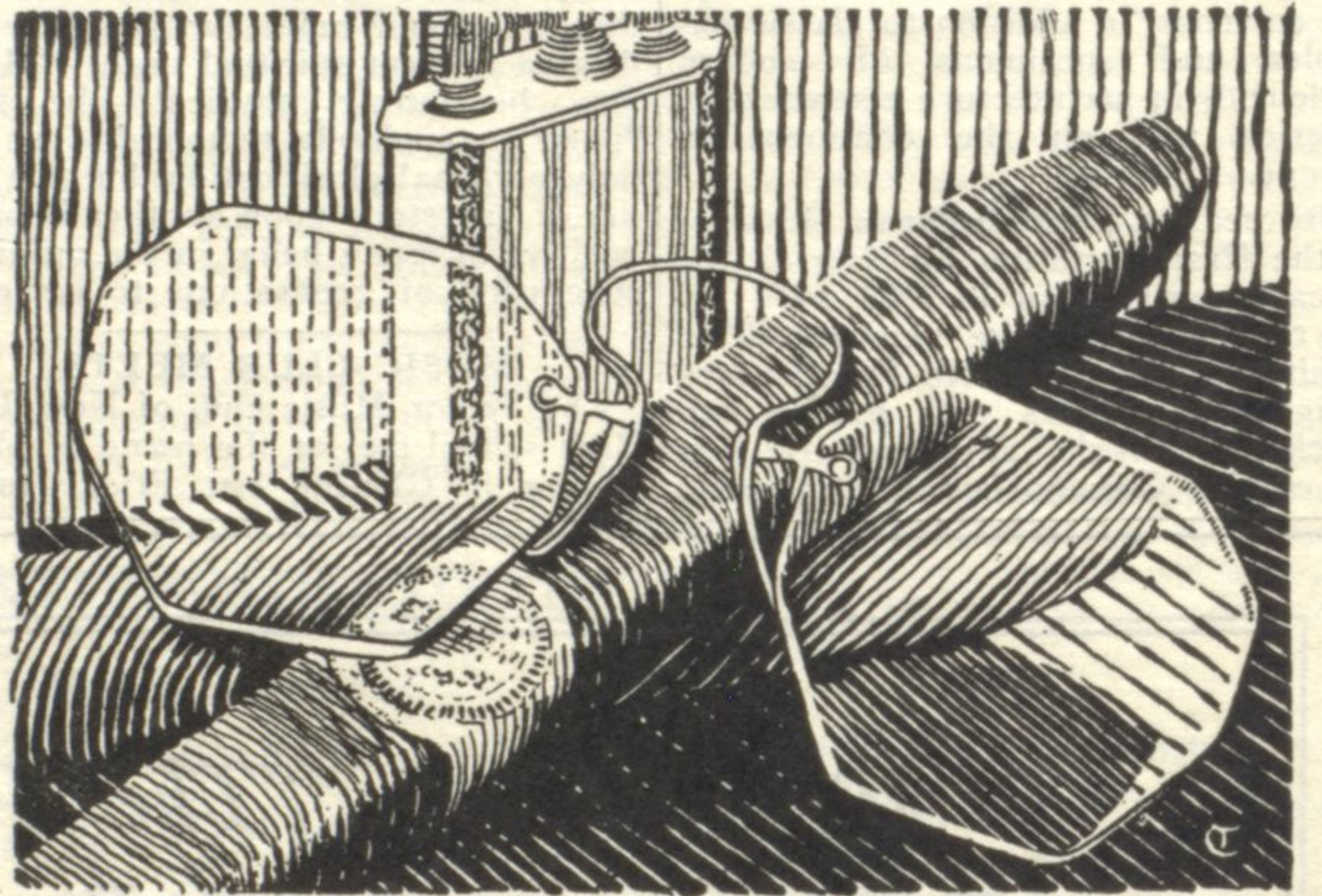
