

Only One Defeat; Winnetka Loses 14-0 to Highwood

The Winnetka foot ball season came to a close last Sunday, with the only defeat the locals have encountered.

The score was 14 to 0, in favor of the strong Highwood team, which, from the opening whistle, appeared to have a two-fold objective; first, to knock out Agate Martin, and second, to win the game.

Their second touchdown came in the last quarter by an off-tackle plunge by their fullback, terminating the score 14-0 in favor of Highwood.

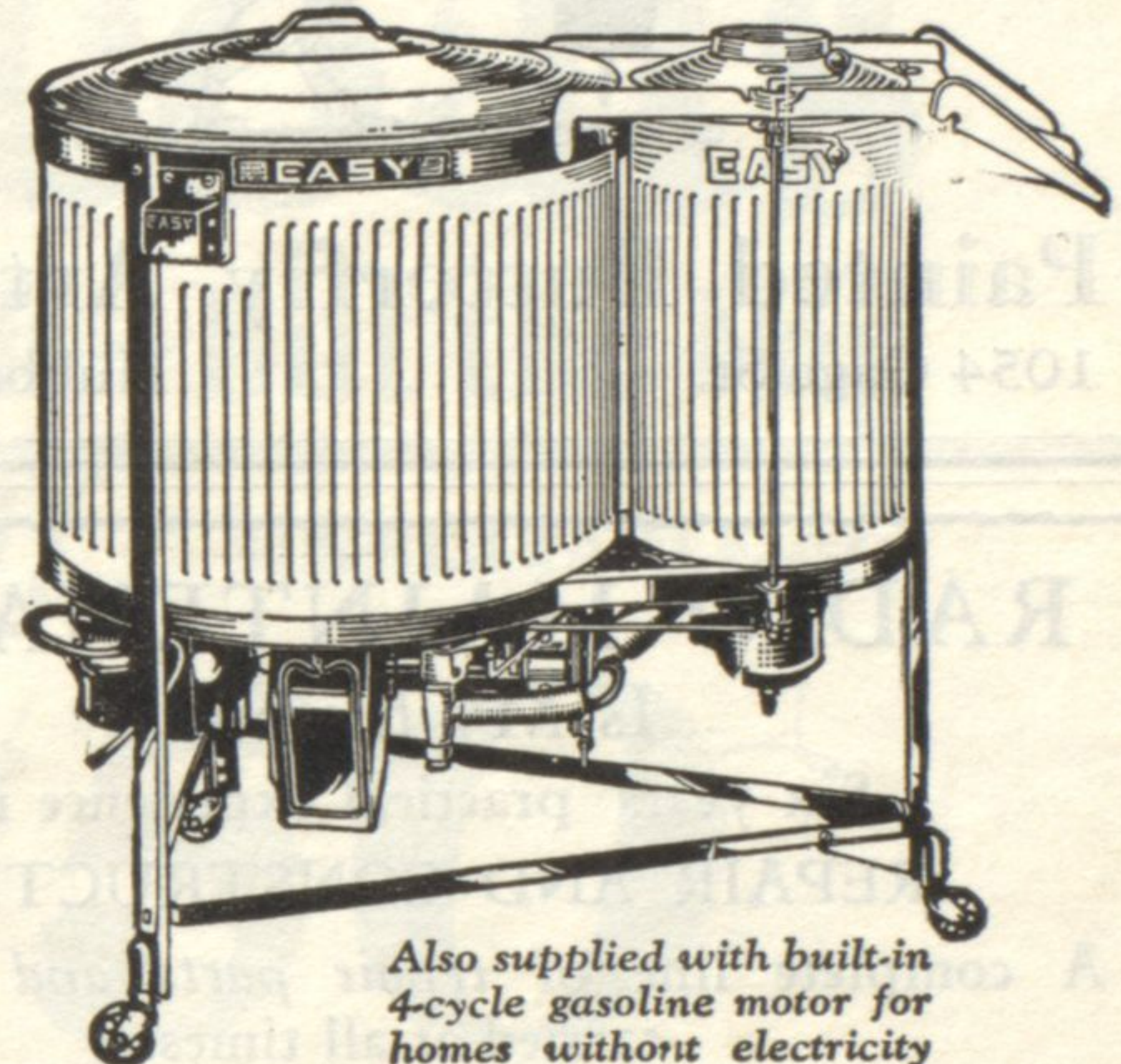
