"Mes amis, écoutez!"

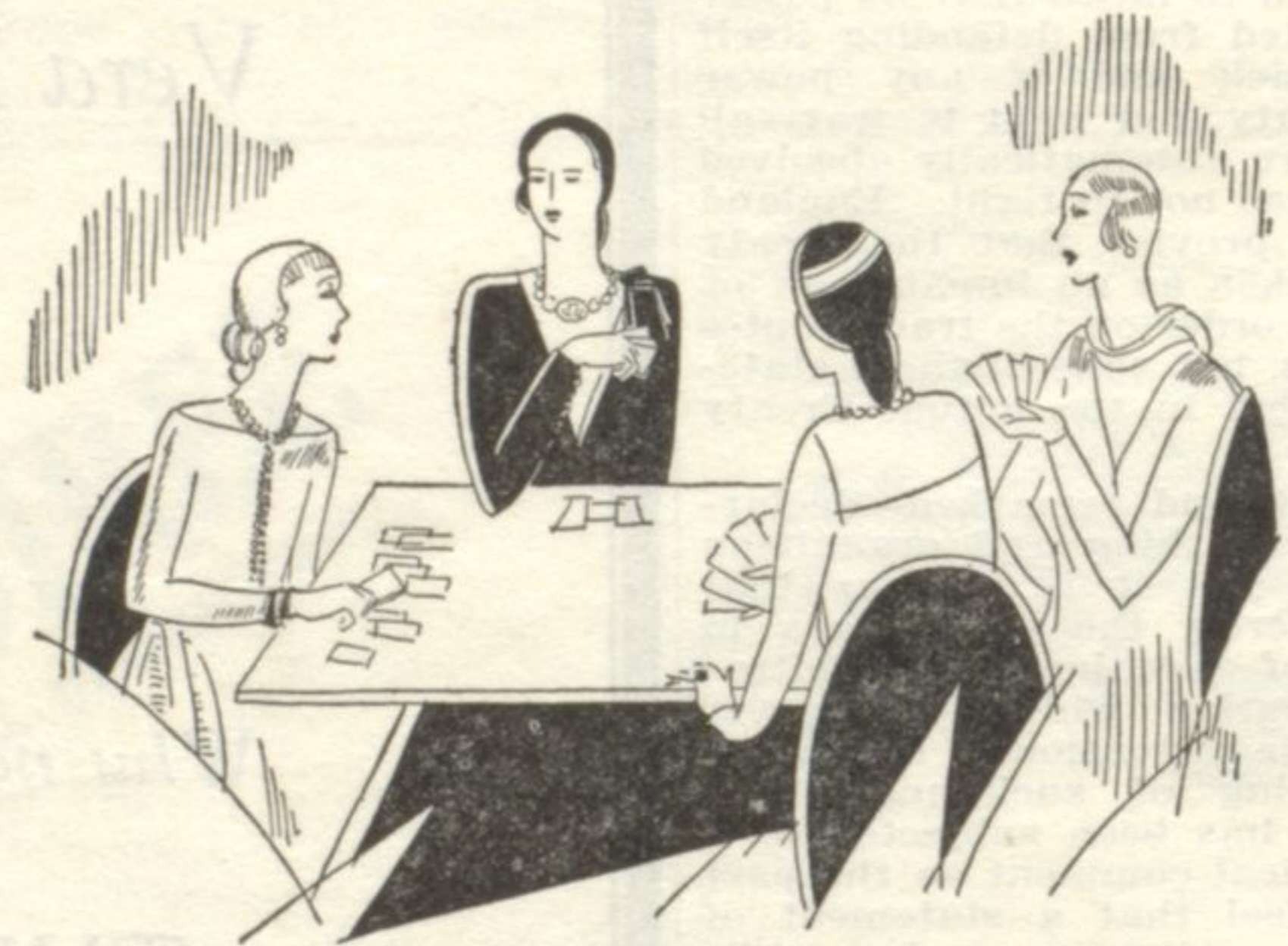
